What the charity does: The Carse of Stirling Partnership is a community-driven charity which aims to enhance the local environment, promote sustainable land management practice and farming, and foster community engagement across the Carse of Stirling area. This is a significant floodplain of major historic significance located west of Stirling, Scotland, characterized by its rich agricultural land and diverse wildlife habitats. Formerly a wet and marshy area, it is being transformed into a vibrant ecosystem that supports various species including farmland birds and wildflowers. At its heart lies the Flanders Moss National Nature Reserve, known for its ecological importance. CoSP organises and runs a range of projects alongside the local communities within the Carse area. All the charity's trustees combine relevant professional experience to meet its aims with extensive local knowledge of the area.

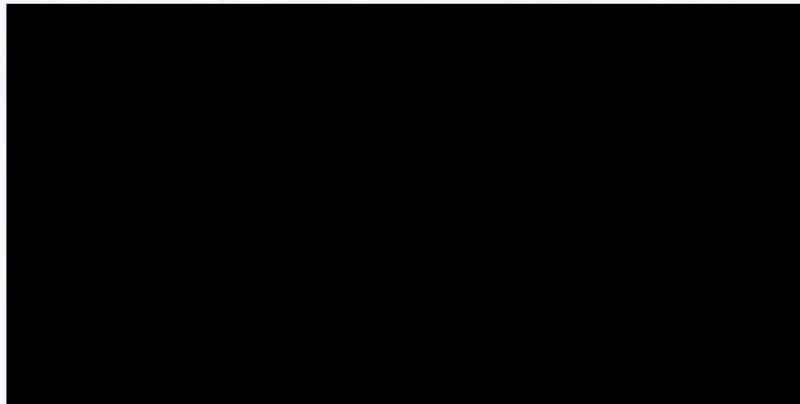

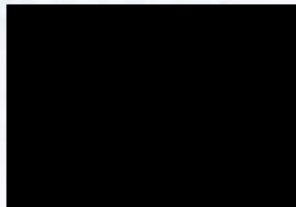

Annual Report of the Trustees

Introduction

The Trustees are pleased to present the annual report and accounts of The Carse of Stirling Partnership SCIO for the year ending 28th February 2025.

Review of Activities and Achievements

The Carse of Stirling Partnership (CoSP) was set up in 2012, with assistance from Scottish Natural Heritage and guidance from the Star Development Group, to encourage co-operative working between land owners, farmers, communities and businesses in and around the Carse of Stirling on land use and heritage issues that might have previously been tackled in isolation. The Partnership's main achievement has been to bring together people from many different backgrounds on a regular basis to look at everything from flooding on the Carse to farm wildlife surveys, footpath access between local villages, protecting the area's cultural heritage and promoting the area as a tourist destination for visitors. The charity's work is particularly focused on the communities in and around the Carse, including the villages of Gargunnock, Kippen, Buchlyvie, Thornhill, Arnprior and Port of Menteith. CoSP has been recognised for its innovative approach to local engagement and decision making with an Award for Planning Excellence from the Royal Town Planning Institute (RTPI) and a nomination for an RSPB Nature of Scotland Award.

During the year, Trustees continued to explore ways for local communities across the Carse of Stirling to engage with local farmers in raising awareness on taking steps to implement more environmentally sustainable agricultural land management. The need for this was highlighted by the Scottish Agricultural Bill in the Scottish Parliament in 2024. After the disappointments of 2023, we were very pleased to secure approval of a grant from Forth Environment Link (FEL) to run two Climate Action Hub community workshops and other activities during summer 2025. These will focus on the impact of climate change on the Carse landscape and land management to give local people a stronger voice in advocating future action in addressing this major challenge. Further grant support received from Thornhill Environment Fund (TEF) and Gargunnock Windfarm Fund and confirmed after the year end, has ensured that CoSP delivers a robust and meaningful programme of Climate Action Hub events in the summer of 2025.

We held our AGM on 4th November 2024 at West Moss-side, when the Report & Accounts for 2023-24 were formally approved and Trustees re-elected for the coming year. We were pleased to elect [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] as new Trustees, both bringing very relevant professional experience and local knowledge of the area to the Board. We also take this opportunity to record our sincere thanks to Iain Semple, who indicated his retirement as a Trustee and Chair last January, for his valuable contribution to the charity's business for several years.

Accounts

The Accounts that follow have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis which reflects the cash flow of CoSP in the period covered above.

Structure, Governance and Management

CoSP is constituted as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation and is governed by a constitution which was adopted in 2015. As a SCIO, the charity is subject to regulation by the Office of the Scottish Charities Regulator (OSCR). The charity has a membership but no employees. A review of the current SCIO Constitution will be undertaken by the Board with a view to introducing a

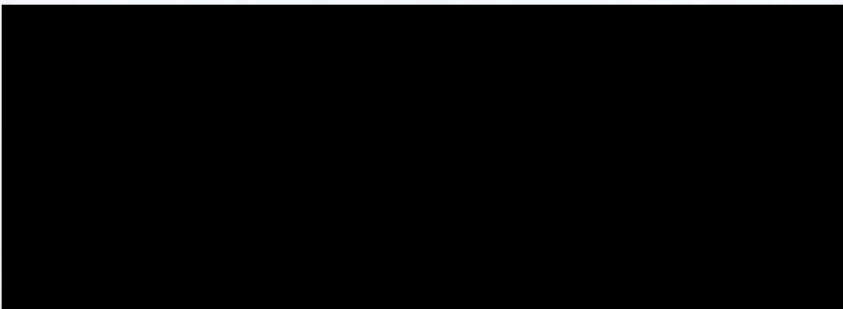
subscription membership scheme in 2026.

Trustees Responsibilities

The Trustees of CoSP are responsible for managing and safeguarding the assets of the charity and are also responsible for keeping proper accounting records and ensuring that the accounts are prepared in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The Trustees regularly consider the risks faced by CoSP and ensure that appropriate management procedures are in place to mitigate those risks. None of the Trustees is disqualified from service under Section 70A of the 2005 Act.

The Trustees would like to thank all the individuals who have contributed their time, knowledge and energy to the development of CoSP during its sixth year of operations as a SCIO.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of The Carse of Stirling Partnership SCIO

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ending 28 February 2025 which are set out on pages 6 and 7 below.

Respective responsibilities of trustee s and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. 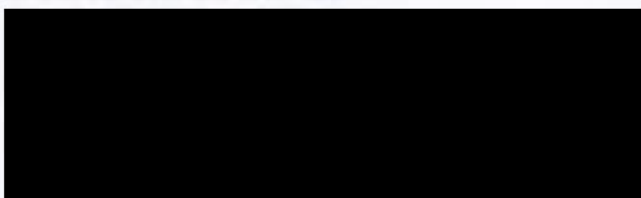
