Independent examiner's report on the accounts

Report to the trustees/members of Friends of Kilbride on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024

I report on the accounts set out on pages 2 to 8

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) 2005 Act and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and, consequently, I do not express an audit opinion on the accounts.

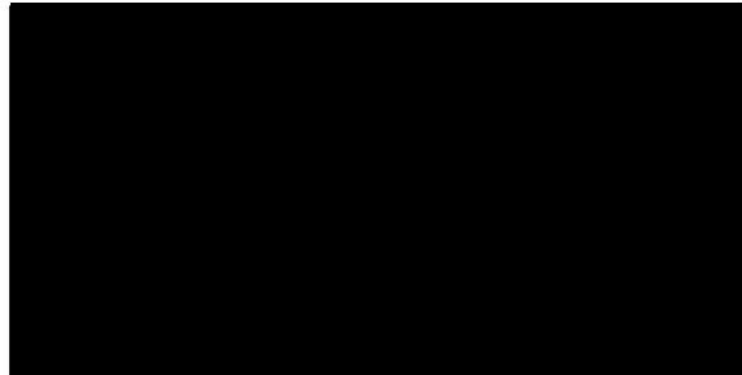

Report of the Trustees For the year ended 31 December 2024

Structure, Governance and Management

The Charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (a SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 4 December 2015. It has a single tier structure and as such the trustees are the members of the Charity.

Appointment of trustees

Trustees are recruited from individuals with an interest in the activities of the charity and with the requisite skills to effectively deliver the aims of the charity.

Objectives and Charitable purposes

The charity's objectives are for the advancement of heritage, by way of preserving the listed sixth century chapel and surrounding graveyard at Kilbride, and the advancement of education and culture by way of researching, recording and preserving the history and records of the Kilbride chapel and graveyard, and providing educational material for the benefit of the public on the subject.

Activities, Achievements and Performance

The principal achievement of the charity in 2023 was the start of our programme of improving the accessibility of the site, with generous financial assistance from the Clackmannanshire and Stirling Environment Trust with the work being carried out by our contractors Heritage Builders. The first stage was the replacement of the dilapidated and irregular stairs with a new concrete staircase with handrails. Next year we will create a non-slip pathway from the top of the steps to the prayer house west entrance.

The D'Cruz Trio presented a concert in September partly for the benefit of the Friends in Oban cathedral. Added to a further recital in London and the annual Carol singing in Lerags House, these musical events raised nearly £500.

Friends of Kilbride continued to make the ruins available for the benefit of the local community with the lighting of the Kilbride Star at the beginning of Advent. Friends of Kilbride also hosted six tours of the prayer house and burial aisle during the Clan MacDougall Gathering, which raised £900.

In May, our trustee [REDACTED] created a new and updated promotional film – replacing the previous one which had become outdated. This can be viewed on our website. [REDACTED] also added an item on the Campbell Cross to our virtual tour.

Financial review

In the year the Charity made a deficit on unrestricted funds before transfers of £1,989 (2023 – £683) and a deficit on restricted funds of £1,030 (2023 – £18,267). At the year end the charity had retained reserves of £2,494 (2023 - £5,513) unrestricted and £nil (2023 – £nil) restricted funds.

Reserves policy

The trustees manage the activities of the charity and ensure that funds for projects are identified either through the use of available reserves or by new grant funding prior to commencement. This means that sufficient reserves are maintained at all times.

Plans for future period

Looking forward for 2025 we hope further to progress the investigation of the medieval grave slabs which we have confirmed lie underground in the churchyard, drawing on the expertise not only of our trustees [REDACTED] but also Archaeology Scotland and [REDACTED] Stirling University.

We also plan to take ownership of the main structure of the MacDougall Burial Aisle the management and maintenance of which the Dunollie Preservation Trust wishes Friends of Kilbride to take over.
