Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

Pachyonychia Congenita Project Europe (PCPE) is governed by its Trustees in accordance with its Constitution.

The Constitution sets out:

- the type of organisation PCPE is, its Scottish Principal Office, purposes, powers, liability, general structure and how it is administered;
- details of its members including qualification for membership, expulsion, decision-making; arrangements for keeping a register of members;
- details of how its Trustees are appointed, re-elected and retire.

The Constitution also sets out their general duties, code of conduct and decision-making powers and sets out procedures for calling and holding meetings.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

The maximum number of Charity Trustees is 7. At any given time; no more than 2 Trustees may be PC Project Trustees; no more than 1 Trustee may be an Executive Trustee; and no more than 4 Trustees may be Independent Trustees.

The minimum number of Trustees is 3, and at any given time a majority of the Trustees in office must be non-PC Project Trustees. PC Project Trustees are appointed by Pachyonychia Congenita Project, a public charity incorporated and registered in the USA.

The Executive Trustee and Independent Trustees are appointed by the PCPE Board.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

1.To advance the education and health of sufferers of pachyonychia congenita (PC) and related disorders by promoting study, research and investigations into treatments and a cure for PC and related disorders, improving knowledge, prevention, diagnosis and treatment; supporting sufferers; providing access to genetic testing and registration of members; organising and encouraging a community of professionals to collaborate in finding effective treatments for PC and related disorders.

2. To provide relief to sufferers of PC and related disorders through the provision of care, support and practical assistance and assist sufferers to live better, more fulfilled lives including greater social inclusion.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

Ongoing maintenance of the PC registry, enrolment of new patients and telephone clinical consultations for patients with expert dermatologists. Contributing to articles published in scientific journals including articles related to research and diagnosis of new treatments.

Disseminating information to the PC patient and scientific communities by means of townhall meetings, presentations and posters at international scientific meetings and through newsletters and the ongoing development of a PC website.

Provision of patient support including prompt replies to patient related queries, advice on how to care for their condition and providing supporting letters when patients are applying for disability benefits.

Driving forward research into effective treatments for PC.

APPENDIX 1

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Provided free genetic testing to those enrolled in the International PC Research Registry and supported patients through calls, social media and emails. Utilising, through email and social media, Patient Advocates that were trained to educate, inspire and involve advocates in their own communities.

Organised the three-day Patient Support Meeting in Lisbon, Portugal, with over 102 attendees from 13 countries. Seventeen travel scholarships were provided to assist financially needy patients in attending the meeting. In addition to the regular patient support meeting schedule, some of our patients and physicians participated in a unique exercise to develop a tool for clinicians to assess PC severity in patients, with the goal of improving future clinical trials for PC therapeutics.

Participated with international experts to reclassify ichthyosis and palmoplantar keratodermas. This group of 18 experts and two representatives from patient organisations spent three intense workdays in discussion and collaboration.

Contributed to a monthly newsletter to PC patients providing details of: upcoming patient support meetings; issues discussed at meetings; and fundraising activities as well as tips on caring for PC.

Monitoring progress in research studies related to PC and other rare keratin disorders and clinical trials involving PC patients and disseminating this information to the PC community.
