## APPENDIX 1

### Achievements and performance

#### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

1. We held the Ethiopian Adwa Victory day on March 2<sup>nd</sup> 2024. We have had an opportunity to bring the community together and invited our Scottish and families. We had history quiz for children about Adwa and Ethiopian anticolonial struggle and victory  
At the event there was Ethiopian food and soft drinks and Ethiopian music and dancing and we had an opportunity to show the Ethiopian cultural music and food and dancing to our children born and brought up in Scotland and to our Scottish friends and other immigrant families.
2. Celebrating Ethiopian new year on September 15<sup>th</sup> 2024 and bringing the community together and showing our children about Ethiopian calendar and new year dress and song.
3. Following the World Indoor Athletics competition held in Glasgow March 1-3, 2024 we met Ethiopian athletes who came to take part in the competition and that helped us to mobilise the community to have weekly Park ran in the summer of 2024 and we have done health education to our community to do daily exercise and fight obesity mainly seen in our children.

### Financial review

#### Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

We have had an income of £770.00 from donation and members contribution in the budget year and we had a surplus £742 unrestricted fund from the previous budget year. We had a total of £1512.00 unrestricted fund available to us out of which:

**August 1st 2024 we had AGM** we held annual general meeting and we reported annual report of the charity activities. At the time of AGM presentation there was some finger food snacks and soft drink from member donations.

We spent total of £125 on the day.

**March 2th 2024 Adwa Victory and Get together celebration and community integration** we spend a total of £250 for hall rental and soft drink, the event was bring your own food share

**March - September 2024 weekly Park ran**

We mobilised member of our community to come with their children to have weekly Park ran at Bella Huston Park in Glasgow and we have given medals at the end of the season for those who took part in the sport exercise and health education in action fighting children obesity. We spend £25 for medals and tea and water.

**Ethiopian new year September 15th 2024**

We have new year celebration food music and children play in the church hall this celebration has costed a total of £250 pound including the hall rental.

We did not have budget deficit

**Donated facilities and services (if any)**

Trustees and volunteer have contributed the use of their own car and their petrol in all the events and activities of food preparation during our AGM, Adwa Victory day celebration Ethiopian New year and organising the Park run and other related activities.
