FUNDRAISING & EVENTS

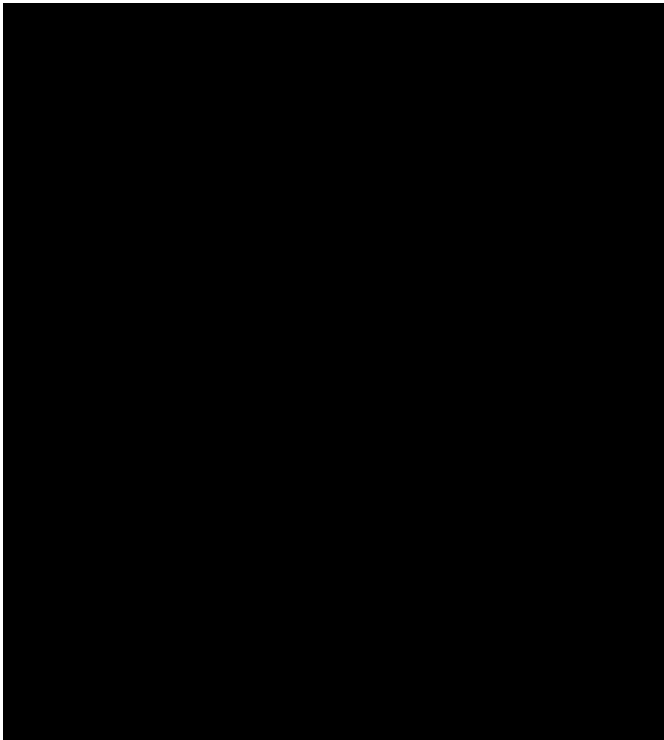

educational environment and caring environment to allow people & dogs to feel safe at our HQ.



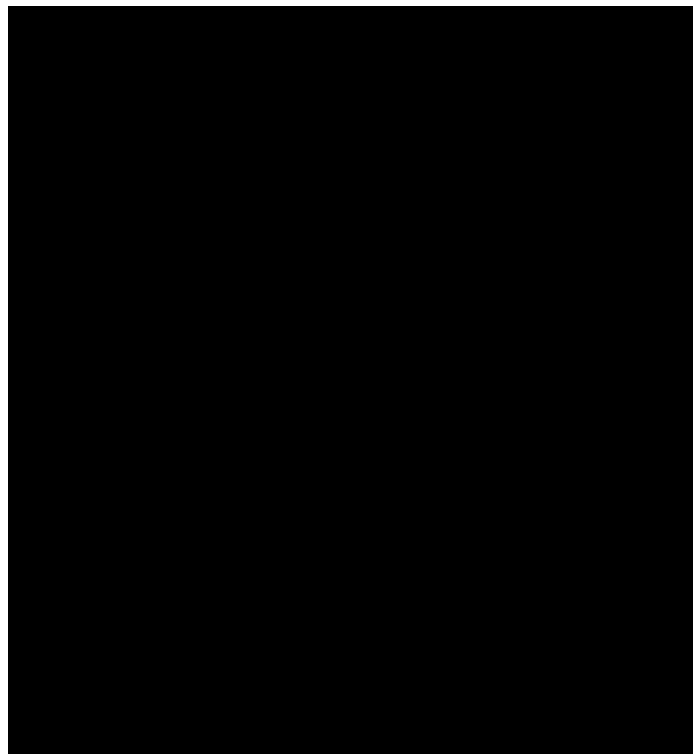
Rescue Dogs





Due to our knowledge, experience and facilities here at HQ it becomes a fabulous place for many dogs to live and develop. With our understanding many of them take massive steps in their journeys overcoming some of their fears and issues. With some of them just needing some of our guidance in their training & socialisation.

Due to the ongoing sponsor from  (Raw Dog Food Company). This allows us to feed the dogs the very best of food which helps with their brain function & behaviours.

Experiencing even more of an increase in the amount of owners looking to surrender their dogs, needing help with their dogs and people looking for dogs. As most of our work is helping dogs stay with their owners we have helped in excess of 460+ dogs stay with their owners with the correct help and support and have had 38 dogs surrendered to us. Seen as we are one of few rescues who will take on a dog with challenging issues. Some of these dogs end up staying in our care long term some of which we are unable to be rehomed so they live permanently under our care due to the severity of their issues & behaviours or for health reasons they may not be able to be rehomed.





As a charity we work extremely hard to try and educate owners with their dogs & continually thinking of ways to expand and better our facilities. Which means that we can offer more & more people our support. having our facilities at a high standard, safe and welcoming means we can help the dogs before during and after they have been in our care. We do our best to help and support everyone who contacts us. If we for some reason can't help directly we will remain in contact until we find someone who can help them.

We continue to improve our facilities, that help educate owners and support owners with the number of owners in need is constantly increasing.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees of Perthshire Gundog and Rescue SCIO hereby submit their report and accounts for the period to 28 February 2025.

Constitution

The Charity is a Scottish Incorporated Organisation (a SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 14 February 2017.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Perthshire Gundog and Rescue is governed by its Constitution. The Charity is registered as a charity in Scotland. The trustees are detailed on page 1 and the trustees administer the Charity. The trustees are elected at the annual general meeting. There must be a minimum of four and a maximum of five trustees.

The trustees shall have the power on behalf of the Charity to raise, spend and hold funds in a bank or otherwise which will properly further the aims of the Charity.

Charitable Purposes

The main aims of the Charity shall be to:

- i. to provide the advancement of animal welfare by the rehabilitation, caring, training and rehoming of dogs.
- ii. encourage the advancement through the provisions of training, advice and support to the dog owners.

Activities and Achievements

The charity provides care and training of dogs at its registered office based at Errol. Carol Begg, a trustee, provides the care and training of the dogs. The results for the period are set out in the attached accounts. During the period the charity held fundraising events and auctions. Please refer to the attached annual report for more details. The charity was successful in training over 400 dogs to stay with their owners and have had approximately 45 dogs surrendered to the charity.

Trustee Remuneration and Expenses

During the year no trustees received remuneration. One Trustee is provided with accommodation rent free, as part of the requirement to remain on site to look after the rescue dogs. The rent for the accommodation amounted to £18,325 (2024 - £17,940).

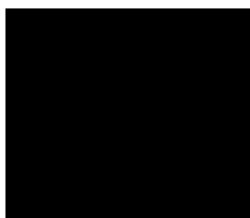

Financial Review

As a result of the surplus of £3,442 for the year, the charity held unrestricted funds of £7,293 at the year end.

The Trustees policy is to retain sufficient funds for 3 months to cover the normal running costs and to cover any unexpected expenditure.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES

I report on the accounts of the charity for the period ended 28 February 2025 which are set out on pages 5 to 7.

Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

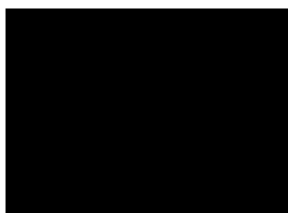

NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2025

1. Accounting policies

a. Basis of Accounting

These accounts have been prepared on the Receipts & Payments basis in accordance with the Charities & Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

b. Nature & Purpose of Funds

Unrestricted funds are those that may be used at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. The trustees maintain a single unrestricted fund for the day-to-day running of the charity.

c. Related Party Transactions

One Trustee is provided with accommodation rent free, as part of the requirement to remain on site to look after the rescue dogs. The rent for the accommodation amounted to £18,325 (2024 - £17,940)

d. Donated goods and services

Donations of goods and services are recognised as income once the charity has entitlement to the goods or services, it is probable that the goods or services will be received and the amount of goods or services can be measured reliably.

During the year the charity received a monthly donation of Raw Dog Food from the company of Bella and Duke, to feed the rescued animals. The dog food has an estimated fair value annually of £2,400
During the year the charity also received donated goods from an Amazon Wish List to the value of £760 .
