What the charity does: Founded by Ashley Scotland (CEO) in 2016, Thriving Survivors is a third sector organisation providing extensive support for people impacted by trauma, regardless of who they are, or what their circumstance may be. This includes the provision of emotional, practical, and physical support for a range of people in contact with our organisation. Thriving Survivors actively promotes the voice of lived and living experience and recruits a range of people with differing experiences and backgrounds. This has supported consistent developments within Thriving Survivors core service provision and helpline which offers responsive, and person centred supports for those affected by sexual violence, gender-based violence and all forms of trauma and adversity.
