Objectives and Activities

The Charity's purpose is the advancement of health, with a particular focus on mental health.

Its beneficiaries include children and young people, older people, individuals with disabilities or health conditions, and other charities and voluntary organisations.

The Charity raises funds to support its activities and to provide grants and donations to individuals and organisations aligned with its objectives. It also delivers its own programmes and initiatives aimed at improving mental health awareness and wellbeing.

In planning its activities, the Trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR) on public benefit.

Achievements and Performance

During the year, the Charity continued to deliver a range of activities in furtherance of its charitable purposes.

This included the delivery of Mental Fitness Seminars and Fit in 30 sessions, which were provided free of charge and aimed at improving awareness of mental health and promoting positive wellbeing. The Charity also utilised its online platforms to extend its reach and signpost individuals to organisations offering professional support.

Fundraising activities remained central to the Charity's operations. The Annual Golf Event, Sportsman's Lunch and Ladies' Lunch were held during the year and collectively raised just over £62,000 (2024: £52,000). These funds have supported both the Charity's own activities and its grant-making.

The Charity worked in partnership with a number of organisations during the year, including Ayrshire College, Callum's Cabin, SAMH and The Little Art School. Financial and practical support was provided to assist with initiatives focused on mental health, community engagement and wellbeing.

Additional activities included the provision of free online fitness classes, delivery of workshops in schools and custodial settings, and support for local communities through the provision of clothing, Christmas gifts and assistance to food and clothing banks.

The Charity also supported the Community Sports Hub Be Awesome Family Food Programme, which promotes healthy lifestyles and family wellbeing.

Financial Review

Total receipts for the year were £164,898 (2024: £139,966). The increase reflects the continued success of fundraising activities and the support received from donors and partners.

The Charity continues to apply its funds in support of its charitable objectives through both direct activities and grant funding.

Reserves

The Trustees have established a reserves policy to ensure that the Charity is able to continue its operations and meet its commitments in the event of a reduction in income.

This level of reserves is considered appropriate given the potential impact of wider economic conditions, including cost of living pressures, on fundraising activities. The policy also ensures that the Charity could wind down its activities in an orderly manner if required.

Future Plans

The Charity will continue to focus on raising awareness of mental health and supporting initiatives that provide meaningful benefit to its beneficiaries.

In the coming year, the Trustees intend to build on existing partnerships and further develop initiatives aimed at young people, particularly those aged 18 to 24.



I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 30th June 2025.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. Basis of independent examiner's statement



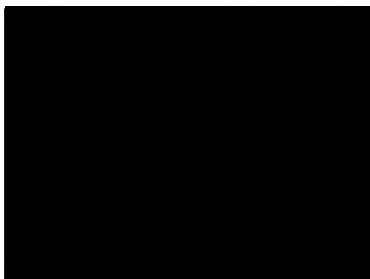

Charitable purposes

The purpose is the advancement of health, with the beneficiaries being children/young people, older people, people with disabilities or health problems, other charities and voluntary bodies.

The charity itself principally fundraises to ensure reserves are available to make grants, donations or gifts to individuals or organisations and to enable it to carry out activities or services itself.

The organisation is established for charitable purposes only, and in particular, the object is: The advancement of health, concentrating on Mental Health. Through our fundraising and contacts, we want to support organisations and individuals.

Activities and achievements

The Charity was awarded charitable status on 26th June 2017.

The Kris Boyd Charity has had another impactful year, raising awareness of mental health through a diverse range of programmes, partnerships, and community initiatives.

Throughout the year, the charity continued to deliver a significant number of free Mental Fitness Seminars and Fit in 30 classes, using its social media channels to reach as many people as possible. This allowed us to signpost individuals towards organisations offering professional support and guidance.

Our fundraising events—the Annual Golf Event, Sportsman’s Lunch, and Ladies’ Lunch—were once again a great success, collectively raising just under £52,500 (2023: £40,000).

These funds play a vital role in expanding our reach, raising awareness of mental health, and connecting individuals with the support they need.

Collaborations and Initiatives

We are proud to have strengthened our partnerships with several outstanding organisations:

- **Ayrshire College:** Through the Passing Positivity and Connecting Communities initiatives, we continue to promote mental health awareness and foster a stronger sense of community.
- **Callum’s Cabin:** We provided funding to support families of children battling cancer by offering much-needed mental health assistance following a diagnosis.
- **The Little Art School:** We are proud to support this independent charity, which uses the power of art to help children in Ayrshire develop confidence, creativity, and social skills.
- **Free Online Fitness Classes:** In line with our commitment to promoting physical and mental well-being, we offered free online fitness classes, making it easier for individuals to stay active and boost their mental health from home.
- **Clothes and Christmas Gift Distribution:** We funded Christmas gifts for children in Ayrshire schools and provided financial support to local food and clothes banks, helping families in the most deprived areas.

Expanding Our Reach

We were also delighted to support the inaugural **Community Sports Hub Be Awesome Family Food Programme**, which promotes family well-being through healthy eating and physical activity.

In addition, we partnered with **Men Matter Scotland** to support the creation of a talking group in Ayrshire, providing a safe space for men to share their experiences and access peer support.

Looking Ahead

Moving into the new financial year, the charity remains committed to its core mission: raising awareness of mental health, providing funding to support impactful mental health initiatives, and backing local community projects. We will continue to collaborate with mental health organisations and expand our focus on initiatives targeting 18-24 year olds, helping to create a more resilient and supported generation.

Financial Impact

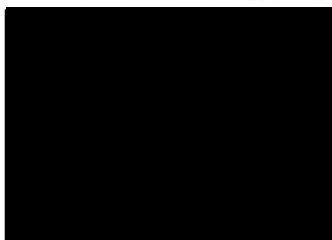
Overall receipts for the year were just under £140,000, a strong increase from £120,000 last year.
