Purposes: 'the provision of recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational activities, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended', 'the relief of those in need by reason of age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage'

What the charity does: Our aim is to attempt to identify parents or families who have suffered the death of an otherwise healthy child (or children) suddenly and work with these families to create physical memorials which primarily serve a practical or educational use to members of the community to which their child(ren) belonged. Examples include. playground equipment or learning gardens. We are also able to, if appropriate, provide short holiday breaks to parents and families but as yet that is not something we have extended to.

Beneficiaries: 'Children or young people', 'No specific group, or for the benefit of the community'

Objectives: 4 The organisation's purposes are to provide recreational facilities for children and young people, with the object of improving the conditions of life for them and advancing education in the process. We will do this by: 4.1 identifying parents or families who have suffered the death of a healthy child (or children) suddenly and in tragic circumstances, such as accidents for example. 4.2 consult with and work with identified families/relatives to create physical memorials which will primarily serve a practical or educational use to members of the community to which their child(ren) were part of. Examples of which could be. a community learning garden, or a playground structure. 4.3 enhance inclusiveness in local communities by the providing such bespoke structures/facilities. 4.4 to fund the production and installation of these practical memorial structures, and project-manage as necessary. Further to this we will also provide relief to those in

need by reason of financial hardship or disadvantage through bereavement by providing services to affected families. We will achieve this in the following ways: 4.5 providing emotional support, advice and guidance to parents and families affected by the sudden death of their child(ren). 4.6 we propose to offer a drop-in service (subject to suitable premises being obtained in the future) where we can offer support and advice, as well as signposting towards relevant help for grieving parents/families. Refreshments will be provided free of charge to those using the drop-in service. 4.7 by providing short holiday breaks to affected parents/families suddenly bereaved of their children (subject to qualifying criteria).

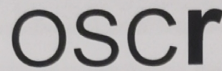

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



Only payments in were interest paid on account balance and only outgoings were monthly fee of £5.

Charitable purposes

The Clinton Pringle Project was set up in 2017 in memory of a three-year-old Glasgow boy. Clinton Pringle was killed after being run over on a shared-space area by a woman driving a van while he entering a park on the island of Jersey in June 2016, she later admitted using a handheld mobile phone moments before running him over. He survived for a few days before succumbing to catastrophic injuries.

The Project's main purpose is the provision of recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational activities, for children and young people with the object of improving the conditions of life. The relief of those in need by reason of age, ill health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

We attempt to identify parents or families who have suffered the death of an otherwise healthy child (or children) suddenly and work with these families to create physical memorials which primarily serve a practical or educational use to members of the community to which their child(ren) belonged. For example these could be items of playground equipment or a learning garden. We are also able to, if appropriate, to provide short holiday breaks to parents and families although that is something we've yet to extend to.
