The Cathcart Parish Place Names project was launched and good progress is being made.

Various publications produced by LCH about the Battle of Langside and the local community during two world wars, continue to be very popular.

LCH works with the University of Glasgow to offer a career development opportunity to students and have added three student committee members who brought their skills and perspectives.
