Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

NMCS continued working towards advancing Islamic knowledge within our community and supporting the development of our community. This includes organising Islamic lectures and seminars to discuss issues reflective of our community. This year, we organised and funded an empowering program "A day with the Mentors: Inspiring Young Muslim Minds," The event aimed at motivating and empowering 100 young individuals between the age of 5 – 12 years. The event featured a child-focused discussion and breakout sessions set in a hall decorated specifically with children in mind. We also continued our weekly prayer meetings, monthly qur'anic recitation, and Quran diet programmes where our children are respectfully thought morals and Islamic knowledge.

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Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Again, this year, NMCS organised a mentoring day that brought together Black professionals to inspire and guide children in their journey as Scottish, Black, African, and Muslim individuals. The professionals included a medical doctor, an assistant professor, a mental health advocate and social media personality, and a registered nurse. Together with parents volunteers they fostered self-confidence, leadership, and goals achievement, providing a platform for mentorship and inspiration within our organisation. NMCS also continued to raise funds towards the acquisition of a centre, some of which included donations from the provision of subsidized Ramadan gift hamper to members. NMCS successfully supported women and young girls within the organisation through monthly sisters educational/interactive sessions and mental health awareness. NMCS organised social Eid gatherings to celebrate Ramadan and Eid ul Kabir. The annual general meeting was held on the 21st of December, 2025
