TRUSTEES REPORT

Cycle Speedway was introduced to Fife in 2012. It has been a great success, due to the ease of participation and the team aspect of it. Since the introduction of the sport in the region Fife are now one of the biggest clubs in the UK and are at the forefront of promoting the sport North of the border.

We became a fully constituted charity in 2017 (SC047998), the trustees are made up of pupils from the schools involved and parents.

We joined the British Northern Division 2 League in the same year. Since our establishment, we have become British Northern Division 2 Champions in 2018, 2021 and 2023. Our U13 team (Division 3) were also crowned Scottish League Champions in 2021. Fife have won the Scottish League in 2022, 2023 and 2024.

We also supported 7 of our members to become British Cycling Coaches. Craig Masson has become a British Cycling Coach Tutor and he delivered his first cohort of cycle speedway coaches in March 2026.

On the track, we were once again crowned Scottish League Champions in 2025. We also finished runners-up in the North and Scotland Division 1 League which is our highest ever finish in that competition. We are pleased that a number of our riders are recognized at international level and have been selected for Battle of Britain and Scotland squads.

We had 5 riders representing Fife and Scotland in the 2025 World Championships.

Fife are working in conjunction with Queen Anne High School to deliver a S1 Sports Enterprise Project. This has also involved other local organisations such as Dunfermline FC, Fife Flyers, Edinburgh Monarchs, Cluny Clays and Water Ski Centre Scotland.

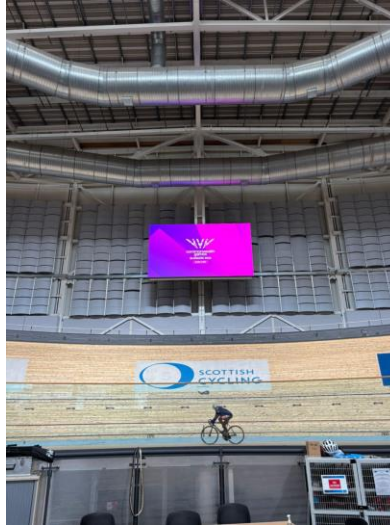
Looking ahead to 2026, we hope to welcome back all our riders and promote the sport further within our schools' program. We are also introducing a Female Only session.

The North and Scotland Division 1 has been revamped with all clubs now meeting on one day over 8 rounds. This should increase competition and make it more appealing to spectators.

Our focus is firmly on growing the sport north of the border. We have reservations about the newly formed Cycle Speedway Federation, the speed of the 'decoupling' from British Cycling and their overall governance, membership fee standardisation, transparency and communication. However, we endeavor to make our relationship with the CSF a success and have become a member after prolonged negotiation. We are fully committed to affiliating with Scottish Cycling and preserving the positive relationship we have with them.

We continue to attract sponsorship and are grateful to all the organisations who help and support us.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Income for the period was £9262.50 and expenditure was £9998.70 giving a loss of £736.20 for the period. Of the loss £3740.16 is unrestricted and (4476.36) is restricted. Leaving a closing balance of £9393.01. Of the balance, £13869.37 relates to unrestricted funds and (£4476.36) to restricted funds.

Our main funding during this period has come from Awards for All and Fife Charities Trust.

For 2025/26, £0 of our funds are made up of membership fees. This was a decision taken by the committee due to surplus of funds from previous year and to encourage new members to the club. We have therefore relied on donations from local organisations to boost funds.

Reserves Policy

At the present time, the trustees consider the balance and future membership fees to be sufficient to carry on the current activities for 2025-2026.

Plans for future development

Fife continue to be at the forefront of expanding the sport in Scotland. Working in conjunction with Scottish Cycling we have encouraged participation in the Scottish League by a Borders, Lothian and Perth & Kinross regions. There will be further development of our schools program focusing on our West Fife primary cluster. Nationally, we have the reintroduction of the Scottish Schools Competition which we are keen to get as many Fife Schools involved with as possible.

UK Cycle Speedway is in flux at the moment due to the newly formed Cycle Speedway Federation and the uncertainty with its relationship with British Cycling. Fife are fully committed to Scottish Cycling.

As the club is growing it is important to maintain our equipment and improve our cycling facility. This will enable us to host more 'come and try' sessions and prestigious events, Home Nations Championship, Northern League Individual Championship and British, European and World Championships. We are hoping more riders enter individual championships as well as maintaining our challenges for league titles.

The trustees are therefore continuing to work locally and seek funding opportunities.

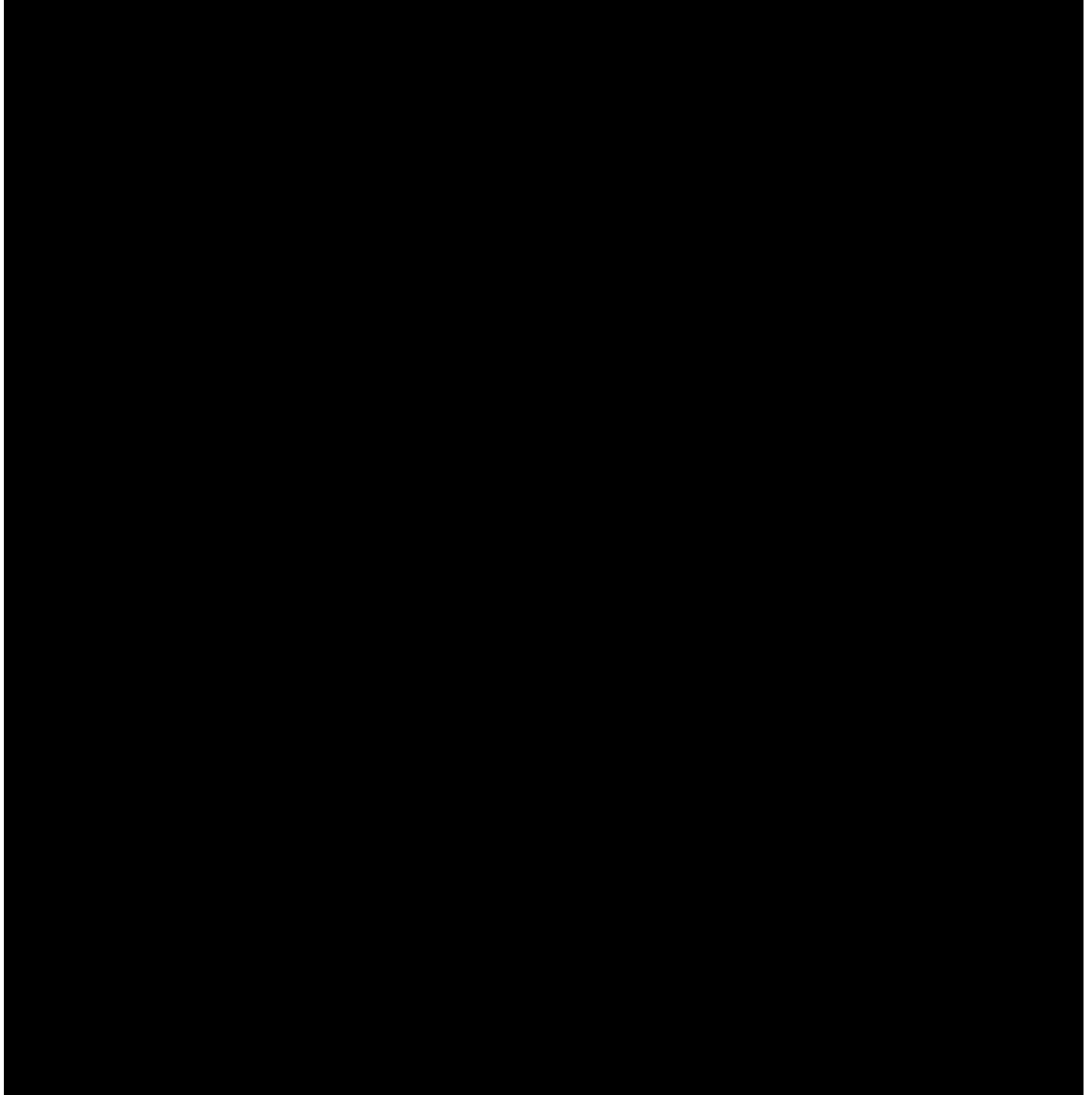
Looking ahead to 2025, we hope to welcome back all our riders and promote the sport further within our schools' program.



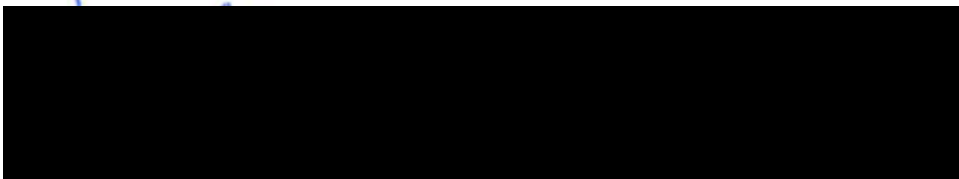

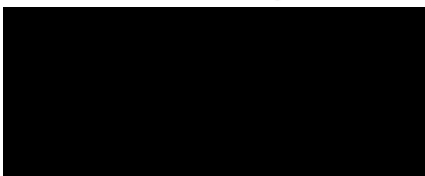
