Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

And - To secure the establishments and maintenance of a community centre and other community facilities in co-operation with the local authority

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

The Community Association organised our usual events during the year including our Harvest Home, a Christmas party and Nativity service then a Hogmanay party to which all the islanders, family and friends were invited.

We celebrated the 80th birthdays of two of the ladies on the island, one at the end of 2024 and the other at the beginning of 2025 and both of these were held in the Hall which had been suitably decorated for the occasion and a superb buffet was provided by the islanders. The presence of two musicians from Kirkwall ensured that both these evenings went with a swing.

The ladies craft afternoons have continued and we again took part in Bag The Bruck. We are planning on having a summer dance or barbeque and are hoping to make more use of our television and DVD with some on-line quizzes and film nights.

We have had more games nights with pool, darts, dominoes and cards on offer as well as the occasional quiz night. Everyone on the island is invited to these gatherings and family and friends are always welcome.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

This is an organisation run by volunteers. The committee ensures that there are enough funds to cover insurance and heating costs for the hall and for running costs & repairs.

Trustees believe that 6 months running costs is an appropriate level of reserves in order to cover the timing differences between receipts and payments and to allow for any unexpected expenditure on the hall.

Although there was a larger deficit last year, the bank balance still falls within this limit.

The charity would like to recognise and thank the time and commitment given to it, by its many volunteers. If it were not for these volunteers, the organisation would not exist, and the many services/activities it plans and organises on the island, would not take place.

The Community Association would like to thank the Orkney Islands Council & the Graemsay Hoy and Walls Community Council for the funding received throughout the year. This money has allowed for part payment of insurance costs and funding towards holding the Christmas Party.

During 2019 Graemsay Community Association was awarded a leader Grant of £19,897 and a CDF grant of £19,910, with these we were able to improve our Community Hall.

The roof was replaced and loft insulation fitted. New doors and windows, a new heating system and a composting toilet were also installed. We now have a more comfortable Hall to meet in and hopefully one that will last for many years to come and that future generations can enjoy.

Due to the Coronavirus outbreak in 2020/21 we have been unable to have our usual events but intend to start our community gatherings as soon as it is safe and when we are allowed to do so.
