Basis of independent examiner's statement

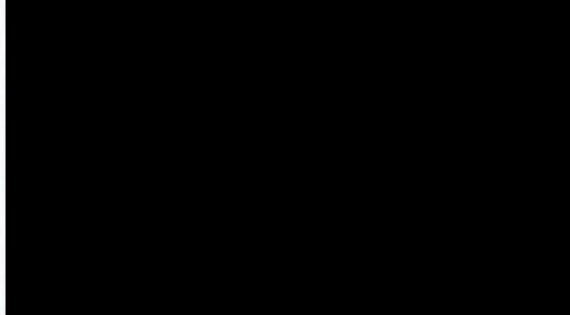

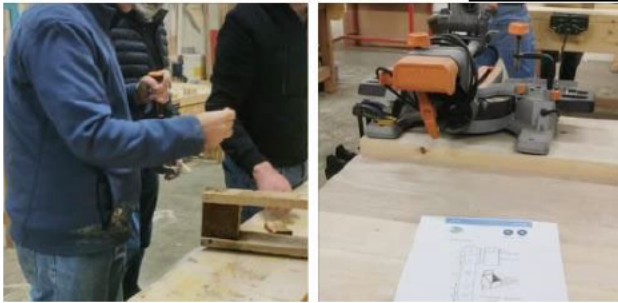
Shed meetings
