Activities and achievements

In the past year, the Band were able to compete at two competitions, The Scottish School Pipe Band Championships and the World Pipe Band Championships. Costs for these trips increases annually to accommodation costs. This year was another busy year for the band attending community events and another year of partnership with Stornoway Port Authority to welcome cruise ships docking at both the new deep water port and in the town piers. Drumming tuition continued in the schools as well as progression for the Development Band members into the main Band. There was also a successful concert held in An Lanntair with the Lewis Pipe Band. The Drummers also had the opportunity to compete in the World Solo Drumming Championships for the first time, which was a great experience for them.

Future plans

The Drummers will be competing in the World Solo Drumming Championships again in October 2025. The Band will also again be taking part in Scottish Schools competition in March 2026 and at least one other mainland competition, as funds allow. New equipment will also be sourced to ensure the Band has adequate instruments for all members.

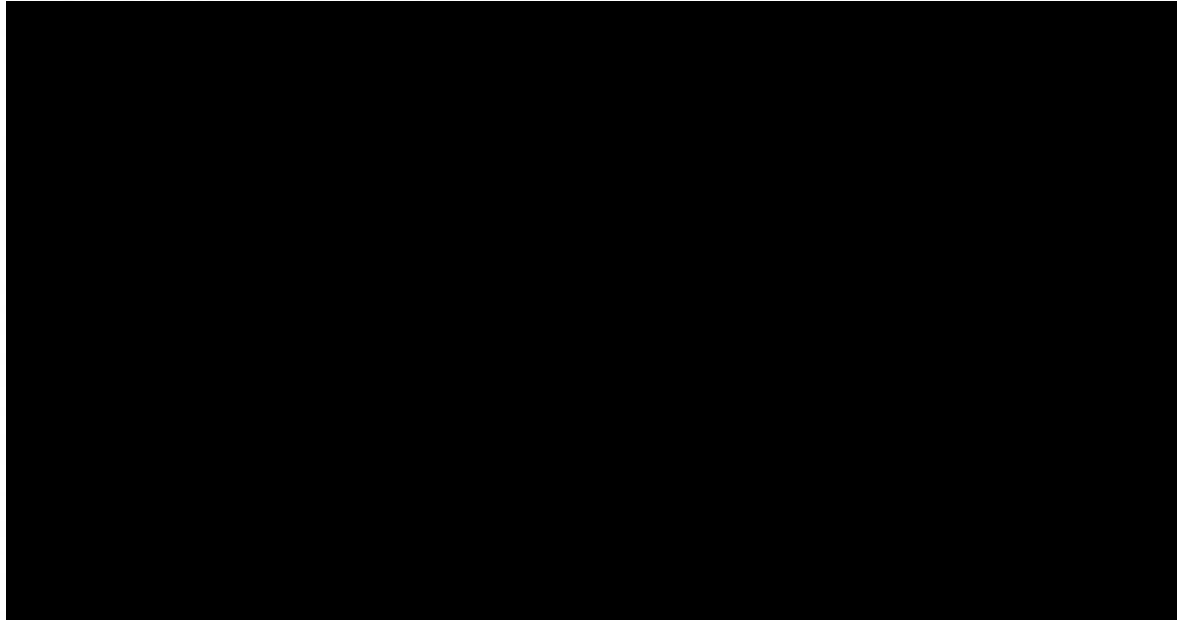

Activities and achievements

In the past year, the Band were able to compete at two competitions, The Scottish School Pipe Band Championships and the World Pipe Band Championships, costs for these trips has increased by 50% due to accommodation costs and cost of food for band members. This year was another busy year for the band attending community events and also saw the Band enter into partnership with Stornoway Port Authority to welcome cruise ships docking at both the new deep water port and in the town piers. Grant funding also enabled us to purchase uniforms for new members. Drumming tuition continued in the schools and we also held a drumming workshop. The Development Band continues with regular workshops to progress members to the main band.

Future plans

The Band will also again be taking part in Scottish Schools competition in March 2025 and at least one other mainland competition, as funds allow. New equipment will also be sourced to ensure the Band has adequate instruments for all members.

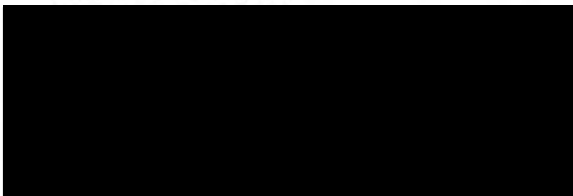

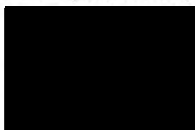
