Objectives and activities

The club's main purpose is to advance public participation in sport by providing opportunities for individuals of all ages and abilities in the Bathgate area to take part in football or football related activities through Bathgate Thistle Community Football Club.

The club aims to promote development of physical and social skills through membership, participation in training and competitive, non-competitive and recreational games and activities.

As of 30th June 2025 the club had active teams and year groups for children born between 2008 and 2019 covering both boys and girls' groups. The club has also established strong links with local Juniors Clubs for players looking to continue their senior football.

Community involvement is central to the club, as demonstrated by the national award recognising the work we do in our communities. We continue to play a large part in local events (such as the annual procession), work with other local organisations (such as the High Church Foodbank) and provide a wide range of community activities out with our core club and team structure. These include (but not limited to) Visual Impairment football, 50+ Walking football, Over 35s recreational football, Disney Playmakers, Claire Emslie and Women's Recreational football. We have also welcomed in a new Warrior's Premier League team (formerly Monster Munchin) to further expand the opportunities available within our club and community.

Players and Participants

We aim to allow individuals of all ages to learn the game of football in a Scottish Football Association and Scottish Women's Football backed Development plan and do so in a fun and challenging way. The club follows the SFA coaching pathway that is proven to provide the right environment for players of all ages to grow and develop.

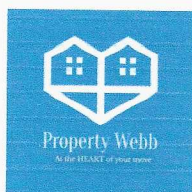
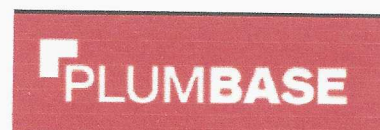
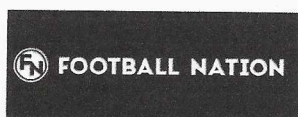

Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

The Club is governed by a Constitution which is available to the public via the club website. The constitution was last amended and approved at the AGM held Sunday 25th February 2024.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

We aim to have a diverse Board of Trustees and Executive Committee in order to make the Club more effective and have the right mix of skills and experience to boost our ability to meet our aims. Nominations and selections are made in line with the following principles:

- At each AGM, the members may elect any member (unless he/she is debarred from membership) to be a charity trustee.
- The Executive Committee may at any time appoint any member (unless he/she is debarred from membership) to be a charity Trustee or Executive Committee member.
- At each AGM, all of the charity Trustees and Executive Committee members elected/appointed shall retire from office – but shall then be eligible for re-election.

The Executive Committee keeps a register of Trustees and Executive Committee members and is available to members of the public upon request.

Achievements, Awards and Performance

The Club has continued to grow and develop over this period, particularly in the girls and community / recreational areas with over 700 participating members in club activity and many hundreds more in recreational activity.

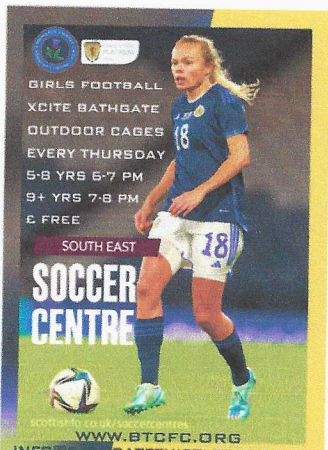
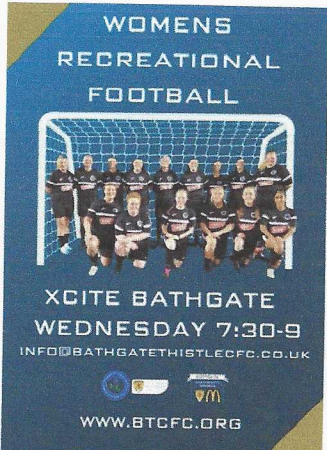
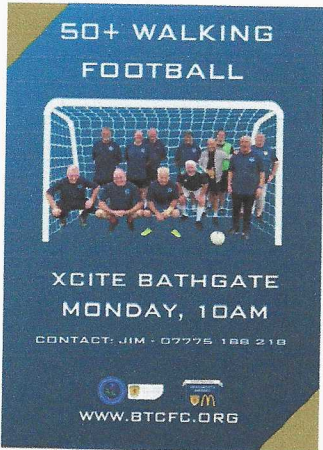
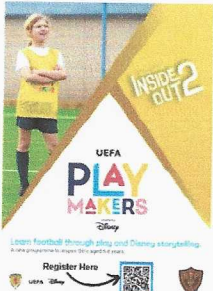
We successfully retained our Active Assured Plus (West Lothian Council) and were delighted to be awarded the top Quality Mark accreditation possible from our national governing body.

In addition, we were delighted to be invited to Hampden where we were named as the best community club in Scotland at the end of the 2023 season. Testament to the work and effort by the club investing in community-based activities and programmes.

We now deliver a full pathway of recreational / community sessions for girls football ranging from UEFA Disney Playmakers, to Claire Emslie Soccer Schools through to Teenage and Women's recreational sessions. We have introduced a Free Friday Football session, providing opportunities for individuals without teams.

We continue to offer free holiday camps (backed by Scottish Gas and West Lothian Council) providing opportunities for a broad range of individuals to socialise and keep active and

connected over the holiday periods. All participants have access to healthy meals, driks and snacks at these sessions,



After thorough review, the club retained the services of Football Nation as their official kit supplier, providing best value and service to all members of the community club.

We continue to review and expand our range to meet the growing diversity and demands of the community club.

Statement of the charity's policy on reserves

Any grant funding is ringfenced and used for the purpose intended. All other funding is mostly from teams with expenditure being the cost of training lets. The club aims to have a reserve of at least £10k at all times in order to ensure the running costs for any 6 month period can be met.

Future plans

We remain committed to developing our players, coaching teams and quality of facilities available.

Short Term Goals

- Retaining access to training facilities to support planned growth
- Continue to improve quality of equipment available to teams and to work with them to identify areas where further financial support is required
- Growth of girl's section by working with current group and adding more players and coaches
- Further development of regular community activity & engagement in new and existing areas

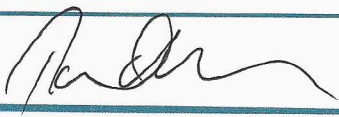
Medium Term Goals
