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

## APPENDIX 1

### Achievements and performance

#### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

**Store Vouchers & Food:** We supported low-income people, refugees, undocumented migrants, the homeless, and elderly ethnic minorities by giving them store vouchers and food parcels to help them cope with the cost-of-living crisis.

**Digital Inclusion:** We delivered digital upskilling sessions for low-income, unemployed BAME individuals and refugees, helping them build confidence in technology use and gain better access to jobs, education, and essential online services.

**Support Services:** Through a combination of phone, digital platforms like Zoom, and on-site operations, we offered advice services for those affected by homelessness, refugees, and individuals facing barriers to employment. We also provided mental health counseling sessions to support emotional well-being, specifically targeting asylum seekers, refugees, and migrants in Edinburgh, along with work re-entry and job readiness support services designed to empower and guide unemployed BAME youth and refugees toward securing employment opportunities.

**Street Children Education Support:** We provided learning opportunities for street children in Bangladesh and India through open-air schools, helping them gain basic education and life skills.
