Objectives: The Club will operate as a non-profit distributing charity whose principal objectives are : a) The provision of recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational activities, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended, and only in relation to recreational facilities or activities which are available to members of the public at large. b) To advance the education of children, young people and adults through the provision of coaching opportunities to engage in the study, practice and teaching of all aspects of Bowls to develop their spiritual, mental and physical capacities and will enable them to improve the conditions of life. c) To support, where possible, underprivileged children and youths, to participate in the amateur sport of Bowls by fostering a community

spirit for the achievement of these and such other similar purposes as may by law be deemed to be charitable and to further the development of the public's appreciation of Bowls.

Trustee's Report

Works carried out:

Maintenance of the green

Cutting the green – Monday, Wednesday and Friday

Edging – once weekly

Scarifying, fertilizing, verti-cutting – four weekly

Club clean-up days – weeding, cleaning of Clubhouse/Portaloo – monthly

Club events:

League competitions – once weekly

Friendly competitions – 5 events held throughout the Season

Internal tie competitions – all members compete against each other throughout the Season

Bowls Scotland and West Fife Bowling Association – the club is used to allow these competitions to be held at our green.

Coaching sessions – one per Season where other clubs attend certified coaching sessions via Bowls Scotland.

Coaching sessions with local primary school pupils – Certified club members and Ian Symonds (Bowls Scotland) attended three local primary schools, giving a taster “Try Bowls” session to encourage the children and give them the incentive to join the club as new members.

Fundraising:

“Family Fun Day” – This had to be cancelled due to weather conditions. However the club did attend three Local primary schools and invited the pupils to a Tri Bowls event where they experienced a taster of how the game is played.

Raffles at friendly invitation events to other clubs to join us in a game of bowling with tea/coffee sandwiches and cake included.

Presentation evening – All members are invited to join the club and receive their trophies won in their internal tie competitions. Buffet and raffle for fundraising.

Unfortunately, this Season the club were unable to fundraise due to being involved in a new building being erected and a sprinkler system installed. £32,600 was gained grant funding applications. The works are still ongoing.

The club continue to encourage the public to join as new members. This Season we are looking to have four new members joining the club.

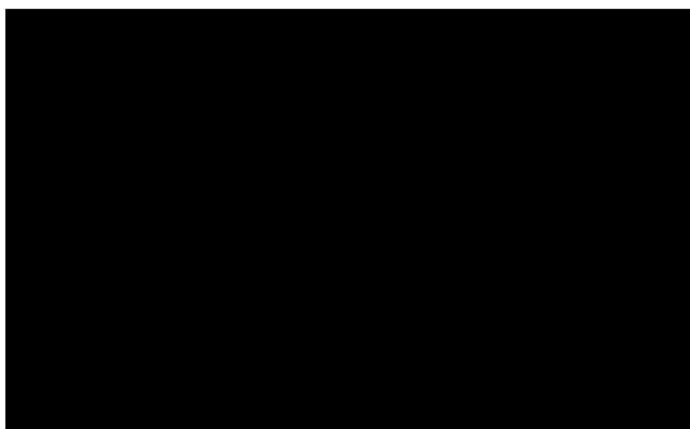
Grant Funding:

£150 gained from Co-operative Society for the supply of paint to upgrade the sheds.



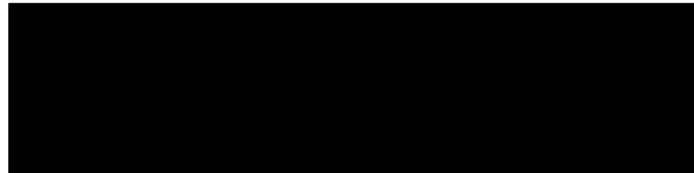
