Provide recreational facilities and activities in Linlithgow Peace Garden for the benefit of the residents and visitors of Linlithgow to provide a meaningful and beautiful place of tranquil peace. The Garden will provide a location for small, free community events such as choral, drama and concerts. It will also provide a resource for local special needs groups, and for the elderly and young. Promotion of peace education activities for children and young people will be actively encouraged. To advance the arts, heritage and culture by incorporating a number of physical and planting features to mark the garden as a key location in the historic centre of the town and in particular to carry on the heritage work of

the old Annet House Trust with its historic? Rig? garden. The trustees will seek opportunities to install items of Public Art appropriate to the location of the garden and to enhance the attractiveness of the garden to visitors.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT ON THE ACCOUNTS OF LINLITHGOW PEACE GARDEN (SC048583)

I report on the financial statements of the Charity for the year ended 30 September 2024 which are set out on pages A and 1 to 2.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and the Independent Examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 (the '2005 Act') and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (the '2006 Regulations').

The charity's trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the 2006 Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the 2005 Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the 2006 Regulations. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and, consequently, I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Independent Examiner's report

In the course of my examination, no matter has come to my attention:

1. which gives me reasonable cause to believe that, in any material respect, the requirements:
