<b>Type of governing document</b>	<p>The charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) and therefore has a constitution as its governing document. It was registered with the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR) on 15<sup>th</sup> August 2018. The charity has a single tier structure and as such, the trustees are the sole members.</p>
<b>Trustee recruitment and appointment</b>	<p>As the sole members of the charity, the board of trustees are responsible for appointing charity trustees. Trustees are elected at the annual general meeting and by way of a resolution passed by majority vote at board meetings. There may be a minimum of three and a maximum of four trustees at any one time.</p>

## APPENDIX 1

### Achievements and performance

#### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Spike Aware UK has continued its campaign to raise awareness about the dangers associated with all forms of spiking.

The charity's workload is increasing each year, and our role is growing significantly in political matters. We are actively involved in proposed amendments to the Crime and Policing Bill, which will soon be considered by the UK Parliament. Our ongoing engagement with both the Scottish and UK Parliaments necessitates increased travel, particularly to Westminster, resulting in higher associated costs.

Media engagement has also expanded due to our participation in efforts to change the law. We are receiving more requests for appearances across various media channels, including television, radio, print, and social media.

Our frontline outreach remains a priority, especially among students at universities, schools, and colleges. The number of presentations at schools has risen considerably. We continue to collaborate closely with Community Officers from Police Scotland and regularly participate in public engagement initiatives alongside officers, interacting with both community members and licensees. Despite these advancements, funding remains a significant challenge. With growing demands from various sources, including parliamentary inquiries, it is essential that we secure additional financial support beyond current levels.

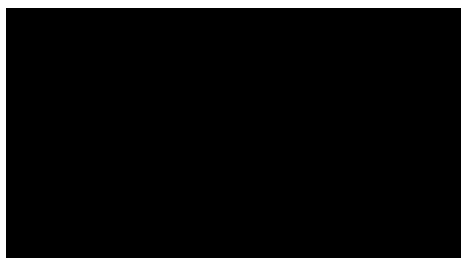
