The area of benefit is Dumfries and Galloway and where appropriate other areas of Scotland.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The provision of literary events, writers workshops and interactive installations in and around Gatehouse of Fleet (Dumfries and Galloway). These were open to the general public except for the events taking place in Primary Schools which were limited to their staff and pupils.

APPENDIX 1

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

In the financial period the organisation provided:

- 1 Book Week Scotland event (November 2022)
- 7 schools events as a part of Big Lit: the Stewartry Book Festival
- 14 public performances plus an exhibition as a part of Big Lit in 2023

Attendances at these events were 550 young people at school events and 620 people at public events: 1170 people in total

The activities were supported by 15 funders including the Local Authority, 7 Trusts/Foundations and 7 local small businesses and private individuals. The activities are heavily reliant on a team of 25 volunteers who undertake much of the fund-raising and initiation, facilitation and administration.

Monitoring data was collected from 30% of the audiences at the Big Lit Festival and shows that in the public-access events:

- 55% of beneficiaries lived in The Stewartry, 19% lived elsewhere in the Region and 26% lived outside of the Region;
- 63% of the audiences were aged 65 and over; and
- for 35% of the people this was their first Big Lit.

Audiences for the schools events lived in The Stewartry Area, so overall 72% of the audience was local.

There was a high level of satisfaction with the Big Lit Festival amongst the audiences for public-access events:

- 96% said that the organisation was good or excellent;
- 96% said the Festival was important or very important to them; and
- 91% said they were likely or very likely to attend in the future.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The Organisation will seek to maintain a position where:

- 1) It is able to sustain 6 months operation without public sector support; and
- 2) Specific commitments made to funding organisations (e.g. in relation to funding for events/programmes) can be honoured; and
- 3) The upfront and cancellation costs associated with an activity that it enters into contracts for (e.g. Big Lit and individual events) can be honoured.

Details of any deficit

A deficit of £807 was incurred in the Receipts and Payments accounts because more payments than receipts relating to the Big Lit Festival in July 2022 were properly reflected in the 2022-2023 accounts.

Donated facilities and services (if any)

The Artistic Director and Business Manager provided their routine services on a self-employed basis at a cost that was accepted by the Trustees as 70% below the local market rate for people providing similar services in the Arts sector.

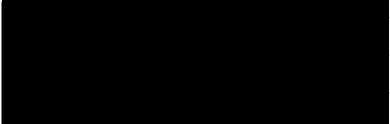
