The charity also donated food products to a local food hub and gifts items at Easter and Christmas to local citizens. The trustees ensure that the hall is maintained at a safe standard and that all local and council guidelines and safety standards are met.

Objectives: The organisation has been formed to benefit the community of the parish of Advie, (the 'Community') with the following purposes: 4.1 To manage, maintain and develop the building of Advie Village Hall and its grounds for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Community without distinction of age, gender, sexuality or political, religious and other opinions. 4.2 To improve the conditions of life within the Community by providing facilities for recreational, cultural, and community-centred activities 4.3 To advance education, citizenship and community development through the sponsorship of community events within the hall, with a particular focus on activities for young people residing in the Community.

Chairpersons Report for year ending 31st October 2024

The constitution of Advie Hall and Children's Fund states that it will provide or assist in providing facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation, leisure time, physical wellbeing and healthy living for the benefit of the citizens of Advie and surrounding villages.

The committee has worked very hard to ensure that this objective has been achieved over the past year. Seven different events have been held, and several donations in varying forms given to a local charity and citizens of Advie.

The committee applied for and received a grant from Pauls Hill Wind Farm to refurbish tables, chairs and kitchen portables. A further grant from the Community Council was obtained to purchase Christmas Lights for outside the hall. Some money from the coronation picnic held in 2023 was used to purchase a new sound system for the hall.

The very popular Bingo Tea was held in November and was, as usual a great success.

Refreshments were served at the hall after the Remembrance Service at the War Memorial at which a representative of the community laid a wreath.

It was decided not to hold a Christmas Service in the church, due to the poor attendance of last year, but the family Christmas Party was held and donations of non-perishable food items were gathered and donated to the local food hub. Gifts were given to all the young and elderly people within the community.

An extremely successful Burns Supper was held, with wonderful speakers and artists and local food served. The hall looked lovely with the new tables, chairs, tablecloths and crockery.

Film Forres sponsored a film night showing the latest Indiana Jones movie in the hall. The film was amazing but there were only 5 members of the community and some committee in attendance.

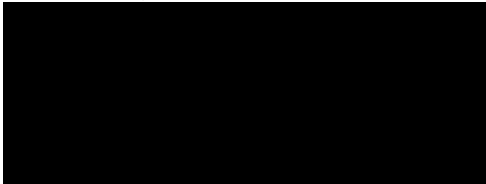
The Beetle Drive Night was a similar story with only 4 people and some committee members.

Advie Hall was very lucky to be selected to providing a stop over for the Long Distance Walking Association on their 48 hour Speyside walk and we were able to showcase Advie.

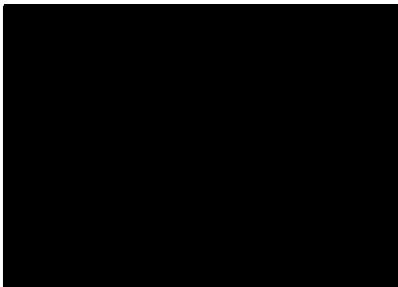
