Activities: 'It makes grants, donations or gifts to organisations', 'It carries out activities or services itself'

Objectives: 4.1 The advancement of the heritage, language, culture, arts, through the provision of exhibitions, events, facilities and other services relating to the historical, geographical and cultural importance of the Isle of Scalpay and the creation of a dedicated heritage centre and archive. 4.1.1 to bring together, hold, adequately house, conserve and document a collection of specimens being of historical, artistic or scientific importance, and in respect of which there will be a strong presumption against the subsequent disposal of any item. 4.1.2 to adopt a written collecting policy and review it at least every five years, which policy shall define the types of specimens which the Society wishes to include in the collection and the geographical area from which such specimens may be drawn. 4.1.3 to maintain an accurate and current register of all specimens acquired for, or removed from the collection 4.2 The advancement of education providing a better understanding of the built and natural environment, culture, heritage and history of the Isle of Scalpay as well as the development of individual skills, capabilities and understanding. 4.3 The provision of recreational and social facilities and activities to improve the lives of the inhabitants of the area and the public in general through the provision of a heritage centre.

Annual Report of Comunn Eachdraidh Scalpaigh (SC048899) for the year ending 31/3/25

Comunn Eachdraidh Scalpaigh has had another busy year and held the following events:

Taigh Ceilidh on Fishing

A second Taigh Ceilidh was held on 7 May 2024 and attended by 45 people. We heard some very interesting stories which were recorded and added to our archives.

Lighthouse 200th Anniversary - Film and Entertainment – Thursday 25 July

To mark the 200th anniversary of the switching on of the Eilean Glas Lighthouse we held a film evening. The Northern Lighthouse Heritage Trust showed two short films about the lighthouse service. We were also entertained by our young Highland dancers and enjoyed a sumptuous supper. Over 100 people attended the event.

Summer Exhibition – Our Fishing Heritage – 23 July to 30 August

Our summer exhibition was a great success thanks to the volunteer team and members who came along to help and ceilidh. Radio nan Gàidheal conducted interviews with some of our senior fishermen – there were some good stories and lots of laughs.

Visitors to the exhibition came from all over the world and we enjoyed telling them more about Scalpay and learning more about them. The bad weather proved a bonus as many people, both young and old, came in to shelter from the rain and wind and warm up over a cup of tea and some of Mairead Ness's delicious home baking. The bad weather also helped the knitwear sales – in addition to the lovely new knitwear donated by [REDACTED], we have sold our entire knitwear stock, apart from one forlorn hat that has been donated to charity.

Our bank balance is looking very healthy thanks to the generosity of visitors and members. We made £1750 from knitwear sales, refreshments and donations; and have sold over 140 calendars.

2025 Calendar

Our major fund-raising activity for the year was the 2025 calendar. The calendar featured 13 (January 2026 is included) fishing boats from the ring-netting days. The beautiful boats ensured popularity of the calendar which went on sale at the Summer Exhibition.

Visit to Harris House

Some of our members paid a visit to our local care home, Harris House, and showed the residents a selection of photographs from the archives. It brought back many happy memories for the Scalpay residents and we enjoyed a cup of tea with them.

Funding Success

CES has been awarded £1250 by the Crown Estates to put towards our Touchscreen project.

Taigh Céilidh – 9 November

It is with sadness that we mark the passing of [REDACTED] late of Oran na Mara, Scalpay. [REDACTED] chaired the inaugural meeting of Comunn Eachdraidh Scalpaigh on 16 October 2016 and was an enthusiastic and active member until illness prevented her from participating in events.

We were pleased to honour [REDACTED] last wishes by holding a taigh céilidh on Saturday, 9 November. There was a screening of Jean's slides showing Scalpay in the 1970s, along with singing and dancing from our young people, and a Memory Board covering aspects of [REDACTED] life. The ceilidh raised £121 for the Scalpay Children's playpark.

Annual General Meeting – 12 November

At the AGM [REDACTED], who was one of our original trustees, resigned in accordance with the Constitution and did not stand for re-election.

[REDACTED] resigned from the positions of Secretary and Treasurer. [REDACTED] had been involved since 2016 when, with [REDACTED], she re-established the society.

There were no nominations for the vacant positions and a decision was taken to hold an Extraordinary Special Meeting at a later date to consider the future of the society.

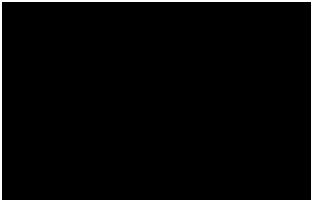

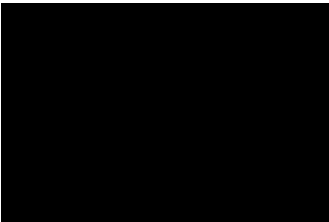
