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Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

During this tax year, Deep Green Space has established a regular weekly volunteering project at Dumfries Museum, restoring the gardens there to add horticultural interest and creating somewhat of an outdoor classroom in the flower beds around the terraced lawns, leading up to the main Museum building.

We have had a regular turnout of 8 volunteers, who have really enjoyed getting to know each other and undertaking different horticultural jobs around the Museum gardens.

Every week, we make sure our volunteers are fed so providing refreshments and food at the beginning and the end of each session has proved very popular.

We have removed some really overgrown ivy and shrubs whose presence wasn't really adding anything to the landscape and replaced these with some very exciting new shrubs and perennials. We have also planted a very exciting bulb display which will last and develop year-on-year.

Deep Green Space have also been commissioned to write a report on the future of community gardening at the Crichton, which is a large mostly green estate on the edge of town. Having delivered a few sessions of community gardening there this Summer, the Crichton Trust – who manage the estate – are bringing us in to design what community gardening in this context looks like and then to deliver the gardening sessions.


