Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

Conon & Maryburgh Outdoor Bowling Club is managed and run in accordance with the charity constitution.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

The Trustees are elected from the club members at the Annual General Meeting and currently comprise a Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary, Match Secretary, Minute Secretary, Treasurer and 4 other Trustees.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

The Club will operate as a non-profit distributing charity whose principal objectives are: (a) the advancement of public participation in bowls as a sport; (b) to provide recreational facilities and/or organise recreational activities, available to members of the public at large, with the object of improving the conditions of life and health for Club members and visitors

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

In furtherance of these objectives, the Club: (a) organises games and competitions on behalf of the members; (b) organises open competitions in which members of other clubs throughout the district are invited to participate; (c) has open evenings in which the public i.e. non-members can participate; (d) provide coaching and instruction as required. The Club also organises social and fund-raising events in which the wider community are invited to participate. The Club premises are made available to outside organisations for various social and community activities.

APPENDIX 1

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

The Club competes in National, Regional and local bowling competitions with varying degrees of success. The Club runs a full range of activities for both members and visiting participants. But the main objective is to provide a facility to promote the social and health benefits of bowling.

The Club was delighted to host the Bowls Scotland District Finals this year. Participants from clubs all over the North of Scotland take part with a view to reaching these district finals, with the ultimate goal to qualify for the National championships at Ayr. This was a huge honour for the Club and is a well justified reward for the hard work put in by the Trustees and members over the years.

The award of the district finals necessitated much work on improving both the clubhouse and bowling green, reflected in the higher costs shown in the accounts. Therefore the Club had several fund raising events in the year, the largest of which was a big raffle which raised over £10,000.

The club also received a Bowls Mark Scotland bronze award this year. This is awarded by Bowls Scotland for well run clubs who meet certain qualifying criteria. We are the first club in Ross-shire to receive this and we now look forward to achieving the silver and, eventually, gold awards.

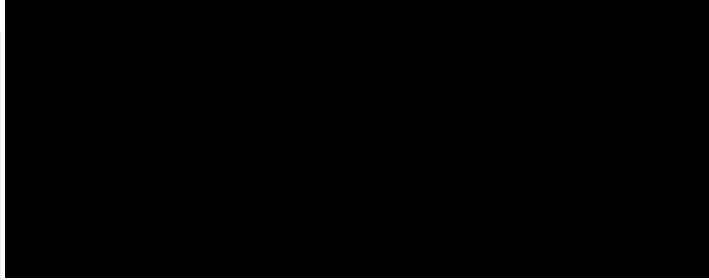
