Activities

Activities: 'It carries out activities or services itself'

Purposes: 'the advancement of citizenship or community development'

What the charity does: Tay Valley Connections is a SCIO which currently has 4 trustees and 3 members of staff who work parttime, and around 50 volunteers who deliver a range of services to the community. Its aims are to build community by helping people, helping people help each other and helping people to get around. As a result there is capacity to respond to individual requests for help, provide help with shopping and prescription delivery and organise litter picks. It provides a community information centre for local people and visitors to the area, plus a growing transport service which helps people get around in one of the most access deprived areas of Scotland. We have a great body of volunteers who make all this possible led by our staff. We reorganised ourselves last year to increase efficiency, connect better with our community and work in partnership with the many organisations in the area.

Beneficiaries: 'Older People', 'People with disabilities or health problems', 'No specific group, or for the benefit of the community', 'Other charities or voluntary bodies'

Objectives: 4. The organisation's purpose is to advance citizenship and community development in Aberfeldy and its surrounding area by providing a local timebank. This will: 4.1 share talents and skills in a mutually beneficial way, to promote community spirit, neighbourliness and improve communication across social groups. 4.2 help build strong connected communities where everyone's time is valued. 4.3 promote community resilience 4.4 support small organisations and small local businesses 4.5 improve community transport through the Upper Tay Transport Group

Trustees Report

During 2023 the Board wished to make the organisation more efficient and accessible, and to consolidate the multiple activities carried out by Tay Valley Timebank and Upper Tay Transport into a single organisation. 'Tay Valley Connections' was conceived and launched in the Town Hall in May 2024. It was a beautiful day, and we were pleased to have amongst our guests, John Swinney, MSP and First Minister, [REDACTED] Councillor for Highland Perthshire and Provost of PKC, a bouncy castle, information and home baking for all our visitors.

After this exciting start we were sorry to lose [REDACTED] as a Trustee. He had led the change process and given us a new look as well as a new name.

The charity has been based in the Locus centre since 2021, and with funding from the SSE Griffin and Calliacher and the creativity of its employee [REDACTED], was able to develop the Information Centre in 2024/25 to be a welcoming and informative place for local people and visitors. It is run by volunteers.

[REDACTED] then joined TVC in 2024 to take over the important 'Community Lifts' service. Being well known in the community was a great advantage, and she now leads a group of volunteers who regularly transport members of the community to places they would otherwise not be able to get to. Most of these are hospital or health related appointments which has built on the previous hospital car service set up by [REDACTED]. It has become an important local service, and like many similar rural communities, an essential local service for which there is no funding support, except the contributions of users who make a mileage payment.

The Prescription Delivery Service and Shopping service set up during Covid have become established and essential, and are delivered by more volunteers. Another regular service is the monthly litter pick led by [REDACTED]. It does a great job and gets to the rubbish the council doesn't manage to collect.

TVC has kept its previous aims, and has worked with Perth and Kinross Council, Transport Section to try to provide more options to get around. SmarterChoices, Smarter Places provided 1 year's grant funding in 2023/24 via PKC to enable the 91 bus, which does the Aberfeldy circuit via Kenmore, Fearnan, Fortingall, Dull and Camserney, to have more journeys and a trial run to Kinloch Rannoch on Saturday. This was a huge success but demonstrated that not many people wanted to go to Kinloch Rannoch, and maybe a Saturday shopping trip to Crieff might be better. The service was evaluated but the hoped for second year of funding was not achieved as the terms of the funding body changed. TVC hopes to find ways to provide transport for people who live on this bus route and have benefitted from the extended service.

TVC continues to support Active Travel. Contact with the community and visitors via the AIC, has been a good way to encourage people to walk and promote walking groups, and cycle. The

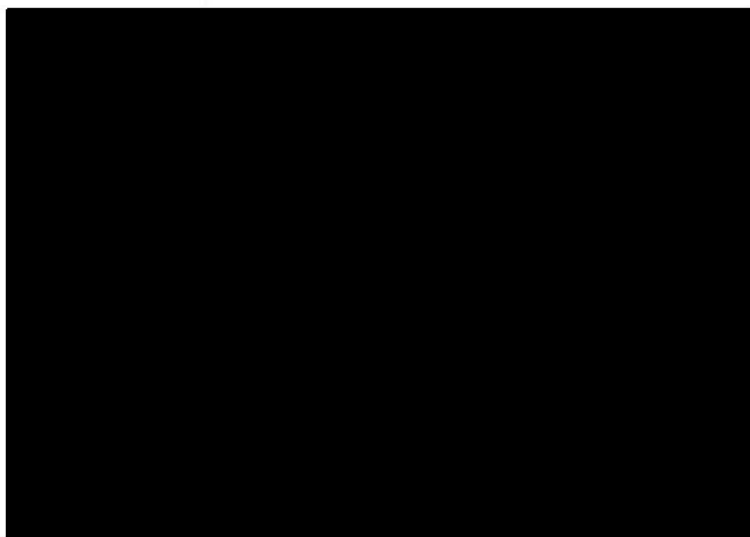
E-bikes owned by TVC encouraged people to try out cycling, purchase e-bikes or encourage people to use the opportunities to hire them. In support of the new Community Bike Workshop, TVC has made its e-bikes available via Draft and Flow, based in the square, and can be booked online.

It has been a busy year which would not have been possible without our wonderful volunteers. Thank you. You all make such a difference to people's lives, its difficult to know how to show the enormous appreciation people experience.

A further thank you to [REDACTED] whose friendly face will no longer be around in the AIC. She will be a big miss, and we wish her well.

Activities of TVC are significantly underpinned by funding from the National Lottery Community Fund, and we are pleased to report that TVC has been awarded funds for a further 2 years . Fundraising and support for TVC like all charities is an ongoing challenge for which the Board is seeking new ways to ensure continuity of the services it has developed for the community.

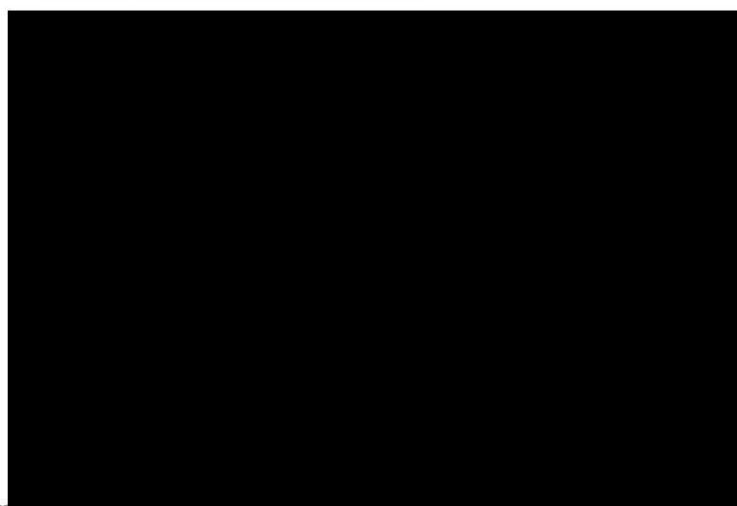

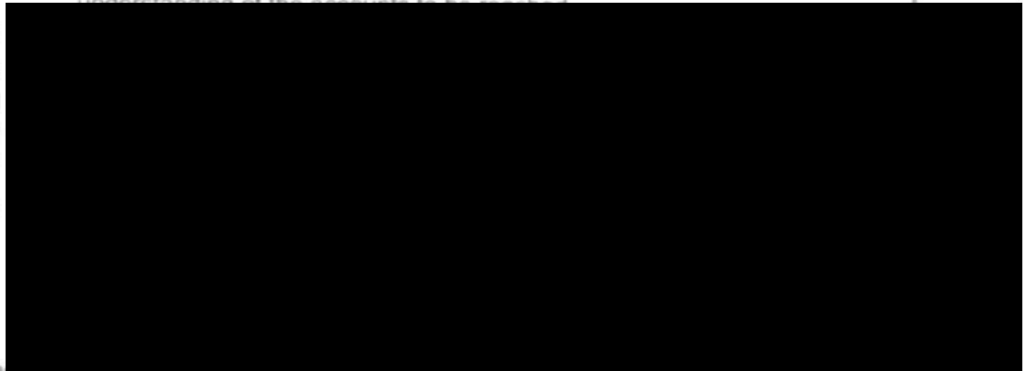
