1.) **LEGAL AND ADMINISTRATION ARRANGEMENTS**



**Charitable purposes**

- The advancement of **citizenship or community development** (including rural or urban regeneration, and the promotion of civic responsibility, volunteering, the voluntary sector or the effectiveness or efficiency of charities).
- The advancement of the **arts, heritage, culture, or science**.
- The provision of **recreational facilities**, or the organisation of **recreational activities**, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended.

**Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects**

To benefit people who live or work within the geographical boundaries of the former Barr Parish Council area and/ or within the geographical boundaries of the Barr Community Council area (the “Community”), to protect the Barr Community Hall as an asset at the heart of the rural community, and to establish a viable and sustainable community facility for all ages and abilities in the Community.



None of the Trustees received any remuneration in the period ending 30th November 2024.

**Activities and Achievements during the period**

A notable year for the community with an asset transfer request for the village hall being approved by South Ayrshire Council; a huge step towards the planned creation of a modern, multi-purpose Community Hub. The SCIO will now submit a formal offer to purchase the

building and grounds. With the suspension of a major government-backed fund, alternative financing will be needed to add to the £130k available from Barr Legacy Fund (SSE) and £120k from SAC's Advancing Community Asset Fund. A consultation event took place hall user groups and other residents to review the architect's latest designs plans. Separate negotiations with Barr Community Shop & Café have led to an agreement on arrangements for relocating the shop business to the Hub. This agreement will be put to the SCIO members for ratification and thereafter the business plan will be updated to show that the Hub remains a viable proposition.

A number of associate groups secured funding for community activities this year with the assistance of the SCIO's Development Officer, including the Monday Club 'Cozy Space', the annual Girvan to Barr walk, Barr Sheepdog trials, and the Barrometer community newsletter. With the valued support of local volunteers, many activities have taken place under the SCIO umbrella, including the highly successful Monday Club weekly lunches and the Barskaig Bash, a well-attended social event organised in conjunction with the Barr Community Association.

A Girvan to Barr walk in late September saw 55 people completing a 12km hike over the Carrick hills. Lunch was laid on in the village hall by the Community Association and SCIO volunteers ran a bar to support general funds with music to round off the evening. It is hoped that this walk will become an annual event thanks to some much appreciated support from residents of both communities. An axe throwing / archery day for the over-50s was arranged in conjunction with Adventure Centre for Education (ACE Girvan). ACE also organised an over-50s canoeing experience on the River Girvan, much to the enjoyment of all who took part.


A very successful Paddy Burns night was held early March with 90 guests. In addition to the usual poetry readings, musical entertainment was provided by a popular local band, a duet from Girvan, and a younger Barr resident. Transport from Girvan was arranged through South Ayrshire Community Transport and haggis, neeps and champ was prepared and served by Monday Club volunteers.

## 2.) FINANCIAL REPORT

During the year, the Barr Community SCIO had an income of £28,639 and the costs incurred were £11,784 leaving £16,855 which was added to the Reserve Account. The SCIO takes a cautious view on reserves and due to the nature of the funding received, many of the funds are restricted for particular purposes.

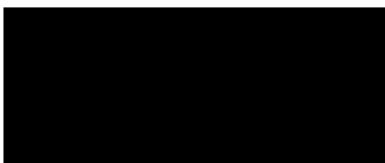



