promotion and organisation of community activities and encouraging the use and development for the benefit of the residents of the community and the wider public.

The charity is a SCIO governed by its Constitution.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

The initial trustees are those individuals who signed the charity trust declaration forms on incorporation. They shall retire at the third AGM following incorporation but shall be eligible for re-election.

From and after the third AGM the Board will comprise of up to seven individual persons (who must be ordinary members) elected by the ordinary members and up to two individual persons co-opted by the Board.

At each AGM following the third the members may elect any ordinary member to be a charity trustee.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

During this year, we continued to work on our Community Growing area which saw an increase in local residents using the allotments to grow their own flowers and vegetables. The area is thriving and now at capacity.

Local Community Groups including a nursery school use our community garden to grow flowers as part of their projects and curriculum. It is great to see our partnerships also growing and seeing the groups share best practices.

We partnered with Vaslan in a Multiply Project where we provided basic training to parents of families who are have difficulty in budgeting their monies as well as shopping in supermarkets identifying best value items to make meals for their families.

Vaslan also continue to support our Mental health and wellbeing project where we hold weekly meetings to support attendees.

During the year we have been renovating the former Larkfield hall which will now be known as Blantyre Community Trust hub which we hope will serve the community and we can run more community groups.


