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The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

#### OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

##### Objectives and aims

ViewCare Project is a non-profit service established by the Church in May 2016. The project is run by Church volunteers (from Viewpark Parish Church and other local churches) and one part time member of staff. The project provides an innovative approach to tackling poverty issues for those in need by providing a "one-stop" shop approach. The Church has placed great emphasis on our mission of supporting people who are struggling, within North and South Lanarkshire and Glasgow, in any way we can and our service is fully utilised by multiple agencies across both council areas and individuals/families from our local area. We provide help for adults, children & pets. Many of those supported display a combination of significant challenges, including those experiencing homelessness, money management issues, health problems, and unemployment and also often have experienced difficulty in accessing mainstream support.

##### Significant activities

The various strands of the service are:

- Foodbank distribution of non-perishable & frozen foodstuffs to people in need twice a week.
- Clothing bank distributing clothing, toys & toiletries for babies, children and adults' items twice a week.
- Home bank: distributing soft furnishings, small electricals, cleaning products and homeware twice a week
- Christmas Hampers: distributes food hampers, toys and gift for individuals and families in need.
- Signposting to multiple organisations to assist people in getting right help.
- ViewCare works collaboratively with CAB once a week, allowing service users to access advice and help.
- Free hot food via blessings vouchers scheme, donated by parishioners and café users.
- Teen Space Youth Café - offering P7+ kids a safe space to get off the streets and get free food & drinks which ran from January 2025 to June 2025.
- A safe space in our Living Room to relax, have a hot drink and chat with someone.

Between 75-95 kids attend Teen Space each week regularly. Kids are fed toast & biscuits every week with pizza & chips or hotdogs once a month. (January – June 2025)

Throughout the church building we have signs up with a number to call or text if the person reading is hungry or needs help. This allows us to help people who are in the building for other activities like baby & toddlers for example. If they contact the number because they are hungry they receive a food parcel confidentially as they leave the building that day.

We also keep 3 emergency food packs in our church office should anyone contact us out of hours in need of help.

Although our Home Bank, Food Bank and Clothes Bank are open mainly on a Wednesday and Friday, we take calls out with these days and regularly provide emergency relief to those in need.

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The donations the project receives are cash, cheque and online transactions. These come from a variety of sources including individuals, organisations, businesses and churches.

Over and above monetary donations the project receives food, household and clothes donations from various sources.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

##### **Financial position**

The attached Statement of Financial Position shows the income and expenditure for the year generated by the charity's activities. Income totalled £27,679 (2024- £32,606).

Expenditure from the restricted fund amounted to £540 (2024 - £7,747). Unrestricted expenditure for the year totalled £35,770 (2024 - £30,534) which was primarily used for charitable activities and support costs. This resulted a net deficit of £8,631 (2024 - £5,675) for the year.

##### **Reserves policy**

Any funds we have will be used for ongoing running costs.

#### **STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT**

##### **Governing document**

Viewcare Project is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation, governed by its constitution.

##### **Organisational structure**

The business of the charity is directed by a board of trustees comprising between no less than 4, or more than 12 members, appointed by the members at the annual general meeting to serve for one year, all being eligible for re-election.

The part time employed co-ordinator is supported by 2 volunteer team leaders and a bank of approximately 16 additional volunteers who run and manage each strand of the service on a rota basis. The Christmas hamper project includes a huge number of additional volunteers who come on board for December only to manage and run the hamper project.

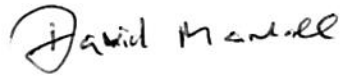

**INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF  
VIEWCARE PROJECT (SCIO)**

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I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2025 set out on pages five to eleven.

**Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner**

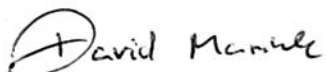

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#### 1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Viewcare Project (SCIO) is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) a charity registered in Scotland, registered charity number SC050184.

The charity's registered number and registered office address can be found in the report of the trustees.

The presentation currency of the financial statements is the Pound Sterling (£).

#### 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### **Basis of preparing the financial statements**

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The trustees are satisfied that these events do not affect the charity's ability to continue as a going concern and this basis is appropriate for the preparation of the accounts.

##### **Income**

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

##### **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

##### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

##### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

##### **Hire purchase and leasing commitments**

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

##### **Financial instruments**

Basic financial instruments are recognised as follows:

**Financial instruments**

**(i) Debtors**

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method less any impairment.

**(ii) Cash and cash equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash at bank and in hand.

Cash and cash equivalents are shown net of bank overdrafts, which are included as current borrowings in liabilities on the statement of financial position.

**(iii) Creditors**

Short term trade creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

**Provisions for liabilities**

The charity recognises a provision for annual leave accrued by employees as a result of services rendered in the current period, and which employees are entitled to carry forward and use within the next 12 months. The provision is measured at the salary cost payable for the period of absence.

Between 75-95 kids attend Teen Space each week regularly. Kids are fed toast & biscuits every week with pizza & chips or hotdogs once a month.

Throughout the church building we have signs up with a number to call or text if the person reading is hungry or needs help. This allows us to help people who are in the building for other activities like baby & toddlers for example. If they contact the number because they are hungry they receive a food parcel confidentially as they leave the building that day.

The donations the project receives are cash, cheque and online transactions. These come from a variety of sources including individuals, organisations, businesses and churches.

Over and above monetary donations the project receives food, household and clothes donations from various sources.

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#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

##### Financial position

The attached Statement of Financial Position shows the income and expenditure for the year generated by the charity's activities. Income totalled £32,606 (2023- £42,205).

Restricted funds received this year were £nil (2023 - £13,800). Expenditure from the restricted fund amounted to £7,747 (2023 - £18,599).

Unrestricted expenditure for the year totalled £30,534 (2023 - £28,211) which was primarily used for charitable activities and support costs. This resulted a net deficit of £5,675 (2023 - £4,605) for the year.

##### Reserves policy

Any funds we have will be used for ongoing running costs.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

##### Governing document

Viewcare Project is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation, governed by its constitution.

##### Organisational structure

The business of the charity is directed by a board of trustees comprising between no less than 4, or more than 12 members, appointed by the members at the annual general meeting to serve for one year, all being eligible for re-election.

The part time employed co-ordinator is supported by 3 volunteer team leaders and a bank of approximately 60 additional volunteers who run and manage each strand of the service on a rota basis. The Christmas hamper project includes a huge number of additional volunteers who come on board for December only to manage and run the hamper project.

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#### 1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Viewcare Project (SCIO) is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) a charity registered in Scotland, registered charity number SC050184.

The charity's registered number and registered office address can be found in the report of the trustees.

The presentation currency of the financial statements is the Pound Sterling (£).

#### 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### **Basis of preparing the financial statements**

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

In common with most organisations the charity is facing potential issues in respect of the COVID-19 pandemic. This is an ongoing situation and the charity is adopting a strategy to manage the ever changing situation as effectively as possible.

The trustees are satisfied that these events do not affect the charity's ability to continue as a going concern and this basis is appropriate for the preparation of the accounts.

##### **Income**

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

##### **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

##### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

##### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

##### **Hire purchase and leasing commitments**

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

##### **Financial instruments**

Basic financial instruments are recognised as follows:

**Financial instruments**

**(i) Debtors**

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method less any impairment.

**(ii) Cash and cash equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash at bank and in hand.

Cash and cash equivalents are shown net of bank overdrafts, which are included as current borrowings in liabilities on the statement of financial position.

**(iii) Creditors**

Short term trade creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

**Provisions for liabilities**

The charity recognises a provision for annual leave accrued by employees as a result of services rendered in the current period, and which employees are entitled to carry forward and use within the next 12 months. The provision is measured at the salary cost payable for the period of absence.
