The Purposes of the Organisation are: 4.1 a. to provide recreational facilities for the benefit of the Community by providing and maintaining the physical infrastructure required for the game of tennis, and b. to promote and develop participation in the game of tennis by means of organising recreational activities for the benefit of all members of the Community. 4.2 To improve the quality of life for all members of the Community by participation in sporting activity. 4.3 To make a positive contribution to the health and well-being of all members of the Community including children, senior citizens and individuals suffering physical or mental impairment.

The Trustees present their report together with financial statements for the year to 31st December 2024. These accounts reflect all the transactions in this year.

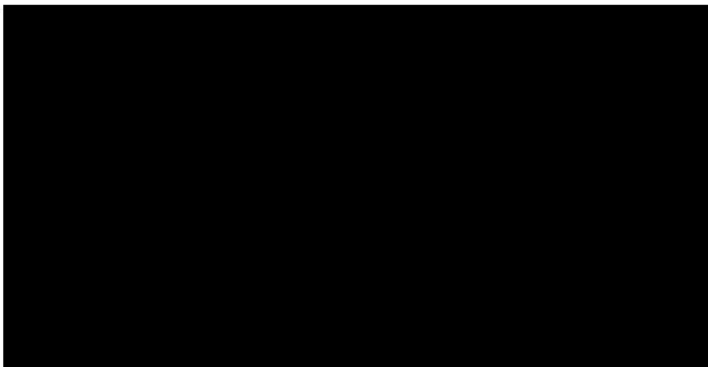

Objectives and Activities

Charitable Purposes: the purpose of the club is the provision of recreational facilities related to the game of tennis for the benefit of the residents and visitors in the town of Kirkcudbright and the surrounding area. Throughout 2024 the Club provided tennis facilities for both the local community of Kirkcudbright and for visitors to the area. The year saw further increases in club membership and in the number of visitors participating in tennis.

Report from the chair

As Chair of the trustees of Kirkcudbright Community Tennis Club for season 2024-2025, I wish to record my thanks to fellow trustees [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. Each has served the club with dedication and commitment during these past twelve months. In accordance with our club statutes, [REDACTED] will stand down as a trustee this year, and I too will not be seeking re-election for season 2025-2026. I am pleased to say that [REDACTED] has agreed to take on the role of trustee together with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. In order to maintain continuity, both [REDACTED] and I will continue to support the new board of trustees, and to be available as required.

I wish also to extend my thanks to the members of the Management Sub-Committee who have worked with the trustees in the day-to-day running of the Club.

Season 2024-2025 has seen the trustees oversee a vibrant, active and community minded club. We offer our gratitude to all members who have shown their commitment to the club, and who in many ways, often small but significant, contribute greatly to the welcoming and friendly ethos and culture.

As a community club, in addition to encouraging the participation of the membership, we are committed to outreach and interaction with the wider community. This is seen in our Open Days, offering taster sessions, engaging with local schools, offering both junior and adult coaching sessions, promoting walking tennis, offering the use of the courts to the children from the local nursery, and in various other initiatives and activities. Our thanks are extended to the coaching team headed by [REDACTED] who offer a high-quality and very valuable service in supporting our community outreach.

As communicated previously to the membership, the Community Asset Transfer (CAT) from Dumfries and Galloway Council has now been completed. This has been a long and often tedious process, and again our thanks must be given to [REDACTED] for her perseverance in obtaining the transfer. It will be the responsibility of the trustees to ensure that the management of the club continues to reflect to the community the asset that the club is. Season 2024-2025 has seen a high level of social tennis, as well as an increase in competitive tennis. Congratulations to the individuals and to the teams who were successful during the season.

I am pleased to say that Kirkcudbright Community Tennis Club is in a very strong position to continue to offer tennis to members, visitors and to the wider community. As a sporting organization it plays a very positive role in our local area.

Governance

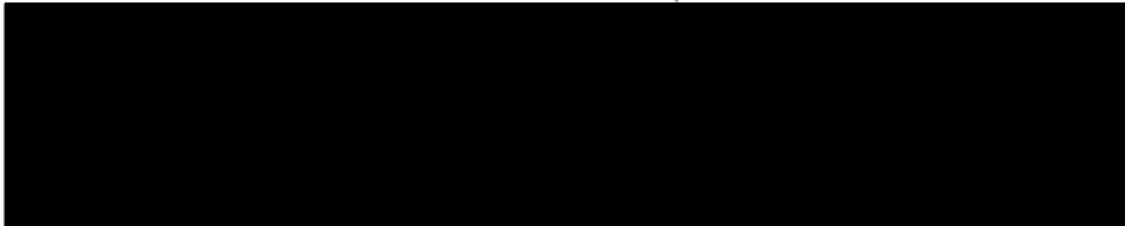

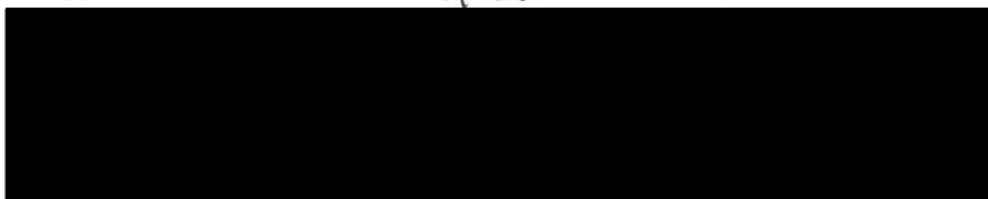

9. CAT (Community Asset Transfer)

The club land and buildings was sold to Kirkcudbright Community Tennis Club on 5th December 2024. It was sold to the club by the Trustees of the Royal Burgh of Kirkcudbright Common Good Fund (administered by Dumfries & Galloway Council) for £1. It is considered that the asset falls within the definition of a Heritable Asset. The property was valued at £75,000 by the committee.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year to 31st December 2024 which are set out on pages 5 to 9 of the attached accounts.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1)(c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 1 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in any audit and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Independent examiner's statements
