What the charity does: We are primarily set up to provide coaching in football to all age groups in a secure and safe environment, with the view of making each person more socially aware and to mix with others to provide them with necessary skills for the future, with this we also are aware that this also benefits all the coaching/ helpers to feel part of building a future for everyone. Our Mini World Cup allows all the children and youths to mix and play football together where more points are allocated to the younger players, which helps get them involved, it works well, we also hold a Football Festival which attracts over 1000 children to our facility to play football. We support our teams to visit other Festivals, with our U16 girls travelling to Barcelona this year. We also support other s by making donations to worthwhile causes.

Objectives: 4 The organisation's purposes are: 4.1 To promote the advancement of public participation in sport and the provision of recreational activities or organisation of recreational activities, to encourage and promote the development of football for the benefit of the local community specifically but not exclusively, young persons. 4.2 The club will provide a safe and healthy environment promoting development of football and health through the provision of children's, youth and senior teams that foster fair play and participation for all, irrespective of race, colour, religion, sex, sexuality or disabilities. 4.3 The club shall encourage co-operation, respect for others, loyalty, acceptance of rules and decisions, personal responsibility, self-discipline and the need for team work. It must be a great place to volunteer and to be a part of, with an

emphasis on fun, teamwork and mutual respect for one another 4.4 The club shall promote participation in football by. 4.4.1 Welcoming new players, irrespective of ability or physical condition and encouraging participation in all development activities of the Club. 4.4.2 Providing equal opportunities for successful participation by all sections of the community. 4.4.3 Assisting all players to improve their sporting skills and personal development through coaching, training and the opportunity to participate in football games, festivals or other tournaments, whether competitive or non-competitive in accordance with the Scottish Football Association's Player Pathway. 4.4.4 Providing all players with training by qualified coaches, irrespective of the player's level of skill. All training must follow Scottish Football Association guidance, allowing every individual the opportunity to benefit from football drills, game related practice and other development techniques. 4.4.5 Working closely with other agencies & organisations including schools, businesses, Police, and Dumfries and Galloway Council. 4.4.6 Promoting physical activity and a healthy lifestyle to all players. 4.4.7 Providing a pathway for younger players to the club's senior team.

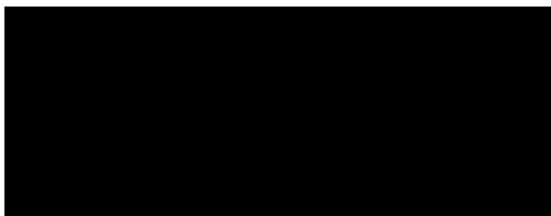

Recruitment and appointment of trustees

The trustees are appointed under the terms of the constitution.

Structure and governance

The Charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) (no. SC050301). It is governed by its Constitution.

Charitable purposes

Our purpose, as recorded in our constitution is:

"The object of the club shall be to promote the advancement of public participation in sport and the provision of recreational activities or organisation of recreational activities, to encourage and promote the development of football for the benefit of the local community specifically but not exclusively, young persons."

Activities and achievements

In the past year we have had the use of the 3G pitch installed at St. Joseph's College. The pitch has been widely used for matches and training by all age groups, which has allowed for 2 training sessions per week for all age groups that wish to do so. This has become difficult to manage with the number of teams using the facility. We have had to keep the temporary toilets at the 3G pitch and will need to keep them until the building situation is resolved. We do have access to changing facilities and toilets for matches, but at the moment there is no access to the changing rooms due to Alarm systems and set up in the school. There is a process at the moment to take over the Games Hall and Changing Facilities in partnership with the Cricket Club, but the process is very slow. As part of the process for replacement of the pitch, since January 2019, £1250 per month has been put into a separate Refurbishment Account. The Refurbishment Account is also where the monies for the new clubhouse (Old RE Dept.) resides (£39,448). The situation is that this will never go ahead and there was a proposal that the Council may take the money back. A decision was taken that rather than lose the money we ask that it be used instead to upgrade the 3G pitch area. There was not a proper run off due to lack of space to store goals and no dugouts, so a proposal was put to the Council to create an area to store goals, build dugouts and a small seated stand for spectators or children in heavy rain. The Committee of the Council agreed to this on the understanding that the monies were spent by Nov 24, The Council Maintenance Dept could not undertake in the timeframe, so Heston ran and completed this project. The one downside was that as we ran the project it was subject to VAT. The Trustees thought that if we registered the Charity with HMRC then this project would be VAT free, only on completion did we discover that VAT was still applicable. The project did dent the Heston funds, as we had a commitment to part fund the works, but we have since recovered this money.

We are still using the pitches at Maryfield as we have 18 teams currently. We also use Maryfield for the Mini World Cup and Football Festival. The purchase of 2 sets of 11 a side goals and 2 sets of 7 a side goals have helped bring the usage of Maryfield to a high level and also the fact we have 4 teams that now play Saturday mornings, which need both the 3G and a pitch at Maryfield available to fulfil this. Due to this usage and the fact the new Grass Cutter has made good work of cutting the pitches, it has been agreed that we spend some funds maintaining these pitches this summer and every year in the future. We have had, over the past year, the services of a slitter unit to hire that allows for better drainage on the pitches.

During the year we have had the use of the Queen of the South Arena. This adds a significant cost to the running of the club, £334/month, but we believe it is a benefit, especially during the winter months for the younger players. If we can get an SLA in place for the Games Hall and Changing Rooms at the School, this should be the last year of using the Arena. The money can go towards the running of the Games Hall and Changing Rooms.

We were able to hold our Mini World Cup and Presentation Day again. We held both at Maryfield - as usual they were a success thanks to the volunteers who helped at these events, though there were the usual suspects with an enormous amount of work to do.

We are grateful to all our Sponsors for their continued support over the past year and we hope it will continue into the future.

The committee have continued to support the coaches in their development when attending coaching level courses or First Aid, without whom the Club could not function.

We have invested in new equipment throughout the year, including footballs, training equipment and portable goals.

We are running with a small committee and struggle to find volunteers to join the committee, which is also a problem while running our World Cup and Football Festival.

Trustee / Committee . Coaches Remuneration and Expenses;

The Trustees, Committee and Coaches did not receive any remuneration or expenses during the year, except money for fuel used in the course of business.

Reserves

With the current level of funds and the fact that we have invested in Maryfield and the 3G has meant that the funds have/will depreciate at times, but we are able over the year to recover to a safe level. We believe there will be no need to increase subscriptions. We project the cost to QOS will be £4,008, Portaloos for the 3G and Cleaning £1,200, Electricity £2,900, Insurance £1,680, league and registration fees of £2,000 and £15,000 to the 3G sinking fund, gives basic running costs of £27,000. Some fees will also come in for the Hire of the 3G from external groups, £3,000 should be achievable. We also put £15,000 by for the 3G replacement. Our commitment on the SLA is £10,000, but we need to be responsible in understanding that £10,000 a year for 10 years will in no way give enough money to replace the 3G surface, there is a 10 year costing in place, which we hope will cover the cost. At the moment the reserves are in my opinion still healthy. One final note is that there are funds being deposited in the main account, at this time approx. 10k, which is coming from sponsors for the Girls U16 team, who will be heading to Barcelona for a football Tournament. The club wishes the girls a great trip.

The trustees' policy is to maintain reserves at 3 months of normal running costs in order to meet commitments and to cover any unexpected expenditure. Reserves at the end of the year were £98,480, which is considered more than sufficient.


Financial Review

**Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of

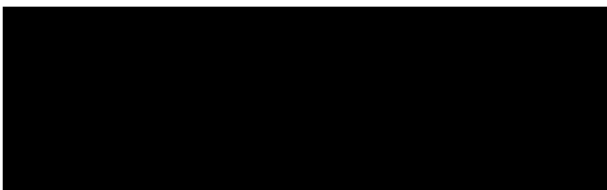

1. Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared on the receipts & payments basis in accordance with the Charities & Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

2. Nature and purpose of funds

Unrestricted funds are those that may be used at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. The trustees maintain a single unrestricted fund for the day-to-day running of the Club.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds which have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes, being the refurbishment of the clubhouse and future 3G pitch replacement.

Restricted funds may only be used for specific purposes. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for specific purposes.
