Assisting members to connect with local activities and organisations in order that they might engage and integrate into the community. iii. Working with relevant agencies to help develop local initiatives to reduce loneliness and isolation. iv. Establishing, operating and supporting peer groups and networks engaging people who are isolated or lonely, people who may need emotional support through

anxiety, loss of contact and those who may be bereaved. v. Maintaining a register of local organisations and activities to which members might be connected. vi. Undertaking, as the charity shall from time to time determine, all other things as are charitable in law for the attainment of the purposes.

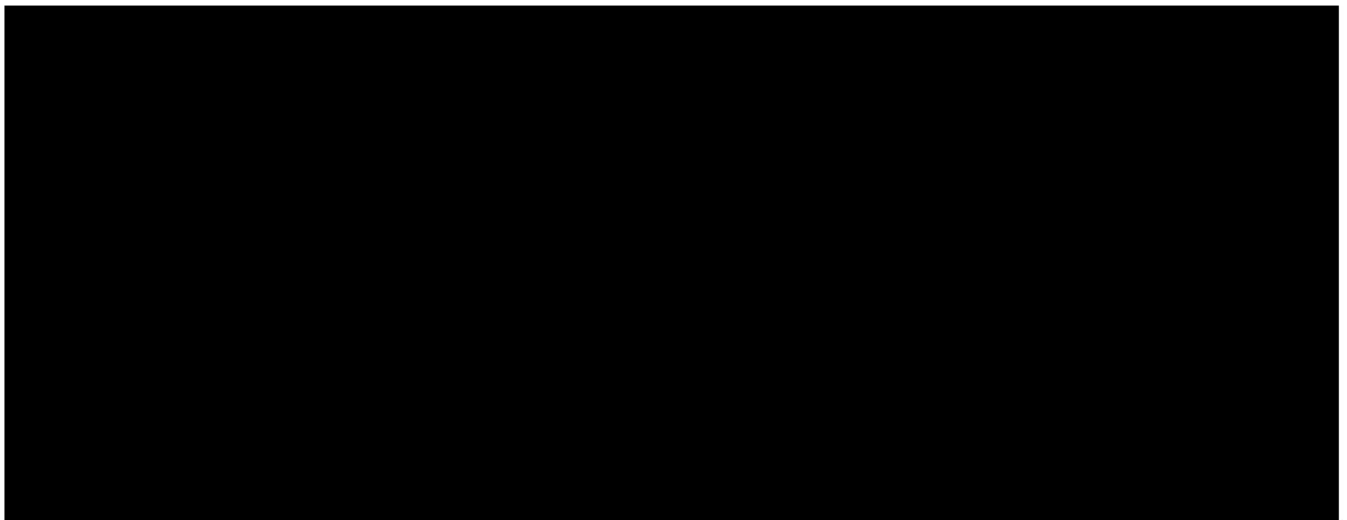

Charitable Purpose.

The purposes for which the Charity is established are to advance the physical and mental health of people in the North Berwick Coastal area by addressing social isolation and loneliness.

Loneliness and Isolation continues to be a key issue today. We are proud to be able to provide safe space for anyone to be able to come and be together, to make new friendships and form new connections

To further these purposes for the public's benefit, we carried out the following activities:

- Receiving referrals from local General Practitioners, other health professionals and community organisations and agencies and individuals (including self-referrals).
- Assisting members to connect with local activities and organisations in order that they might engage and integrate into the community.
- Working with relevant agencies to help develop local initiatives to reduce loneliness and isolation. Establishing, operating and supporting peer groups and networks engaging people who are isolated or lonely, people who may need emotional support.
- Maintaining a register of local organisations and activities to which members might be connected.

Performance and achievements

In January 2025 the charity was delighted to announce secured three years of funding from the National Lottery Community Fund and North Berwick Trust. Further funding was procured from The Volunteer Centre East Lothian. This support will enable us to continue our important goal of fostering stronger connections within our coastal community and beyond. This funding represents a significant milestone for our charity. This investment underscores the importance of community-focused initiatives and of coming together

Our intergenerational work and stronger connections with a variety of community groups continue to be a priority. We are also fully committed to supporting our compassionate Community.

This year we have implemented changes in the way the service delivers one-to-one referrals, Our Milestones programme is for an initial period of 12 weeks provides people with prompts and ideas on how to connect with the local community

This year we encouraged people to drop into the office on a Wednesday morning to chat or find out more about our services, via this option we had a number of individuals self-refer to our services. Our experience here has led us to open a new dedicated drop in service in 2025.

We are fortunate to be part of a vibrant community and our mission has always been to have a community where no-one needs to feel isolated or lonely, by connecting people to local networks, activities and friendship. Thanks to future funding, we can continue to make that vision a reality for years to come

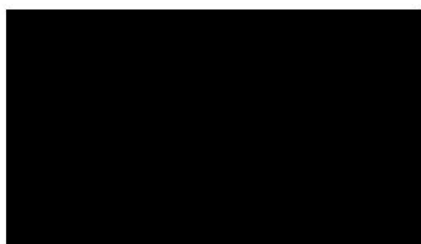

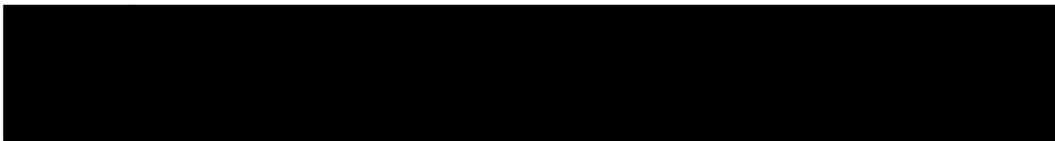
