SCIO Single Tier. SAFE Was established on 23 Nov 2020

The organisation is structured around two main groups: the Members and the Board. Membership is open to any individual aged 16 or over who has an interest in supporting military families in Edinburgh experiencing financial hardship.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

Trustees are appointed through a fit-for-purpose selection process designed to provide assurance that those appointed are competent and of good standing.

Our Board of Directors (Charity Trustees) is elected by the membership. Each trustee serves a three-year term, with one-third of the Board stepping down each year. This rotation allows us to hold Board elections annually and supports continuity alongside regular refreshment of skills and experience.

We are actively recruiting new trustees to ensure the Board better reflects the broad diversity of the sector.

We currently have three dedicated Board members who are actively involved in many aspects of the organisation. The Board sets the organisation's overall policy, ensures it remains financially sound, and provides strategic direction for its activities.

Objectives and activities

The Charitable Objects are:

1. To relieve any person who is in need because of disability or any other disadvantage resulting from unemployment, youth, age, financial hardship, ill-health, or because they are offenders, ex-offenders, or at risk of offending.
2. The prevention and relief of poverty, in particular by providing education, training, rehabilitation, support, employment opportunities, and personal development opportunities.
3. To provide opportunities and facilities for training and experience of all kinds to enable such persons to decide upon, qualify for, or obtain a job, career, or profession.
4. For the benefit of such one or more charity or charities as the Trustees, in their unfettered discretion, may decide.

During the financial period, SAFE completed the acquisition, renovation and occupation of its premises.

In 2023, a Heads of Agreement was agreed with a principal sub-tenant, and GTS Solutions CIC took up occupancy. This provides rental income to offset our rental costs and generates a surplus to support SAFE’s activities. Since then, SAFE has also secured a second sub-tenant, providing additional income.

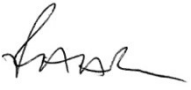

The structure of the organisation consists of the Members and the Board. Membership is open to any individual aged 16 or over with an interest in children in families in Edinburgh who are experiencing financial hardship. The people serving on the board are referred to as Charity Trustees.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

Trustees have been appointed using a selection process which is fit for purpose to obtain certainty that the individuals who have become trustees are competent individuals and of good standing.

Our board of directors are elected on to the board and each member is elected for a three-year period, with one-third of the board stepping down each year, allowing us to keep a yearly board election.

We are actively recruiting for new trustees to reflect the broad diversity of the sector.

We currently have 4 dedicated board members, actively involved in the many aspects of the organisation. Our board control the overall policy of the organisation makes sure it is financially sound and steers the activities of the organisation.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

The Charitable Objects are:

1. to relieve any person who is in need because of any disability or because of any other disadvantage resulting from unemployment, youth, age, financial hardship, ill-health or because they are offenders, ex-offenders or are at risk of offending;
2. the prevention and relief of poverty; in particular by providing education, training, rehabilitation, support, employment opportunities and personal development opportunities;
3. to provide opportunities and facilities for training and experience of all kinds to enable such persons to decide upon, qualify for or obtain a job, career or professions;
4. for the benefit of such one or more Charity or Charities as the Trustees in their unfettered discretion may decide; or
5. for the implementation or assistance in implementing any Charitable Purpose or purposes as the Trustees in their unfettered discretion may decide.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

Main activities include development of premises and development of income generation to ensure sustainability and longevity. External activities include work with community groups and military veterans with a wider remit charitable aim of improving public safety, and a more narrow aim of supporting military veterans families, and bereaved direct relations of veterans.
