Trustees Annual Report for the period: 30/12/2023 to 31/12/2024

Overview

The work of the GRI (Global Rewilding Initiative) is unusual in that, to date, our Rewilding activities continue to be all online. Our charitable status allows us to receive free advertising from Google, which we use to promote the importance of rewilding and provide information on new rewilding methods.

To these ends, we have not needed to fundraise, therefore, we have no actual Finances to report and therefore nothing to be audited. Our minimal financial requirements are met by our Trustees directly, without passing through the GRI itself, as the cost of audited accounts would be considerably more than would normally need to run the charity.

In future we may well engage in activities that are on-the-ground, but at this time we measure our effectiveness in terms of visitors to our website. The vast majority of our website visitors, around 95% or more, are due to the free advertising which Google grants us. Therefore, without this facility from Google, and without the Charitable status which Google require of us to obtain it, our work would have little or no effect.

We are very grateful to OSCR for our charitable status, and to Google for the advertising facility they grant us, thereby enabling us to reach far more people with our Rewilding message than would be possible otherwise.

Structure, governance and management

The GRI (Global Rewilding Initiative) is governed by our constitution. We have a board of Trustees which oversees the activities of the charity.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

The admin of the Google AdGrant Account, for advertising the web pages and creating additional web pages to achieve these results.

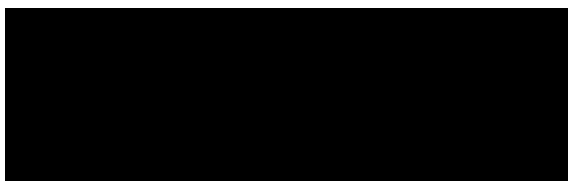
Donated facilities and services (if any)
