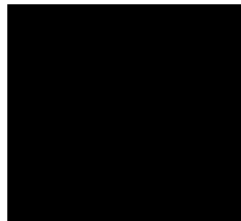

Report of the Trustees FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2024

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The organization's purposes are to provide:-

- the advancement of health;
 - the saving of lives;
 - the relief of those in need by reason of age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage;
- by assisting vulnerable people in need, in Glasgow City Centre, through the provision of first aid and welfare assistance.

Significant activities

GSA volunteers provide medical and welfare support in Glasgow city centre on a Friday and Saturday (19:30-04:00).

The volunteers work alongside SAS, Police Scotland, British Transport Police, Glasgow City Council and other third-party services to identify individuals who require medical or welfare assistance during the stated hours. We support organisations like Homeless Project Scotland and The Street Pastors.

The level of support given can be in the form of advice, first aid, referral to another healthcare or welfare service, safeguarding or emergency treatment. Transport to hospital can be provided or assessment in the newly opened medical and welfare centre, which has now been opened for a full year.

- Expansion of the team to 66 volunteers.
- Upcoming election of new trustees.
- 6,046 patients have received medical or welfare support since the first shift on 12/10/2020.
- New fundraising partnership with University of Glasgow Nursing Society.

- Successful fundraising events - fundraising days in Glasgow City Centre, Braehead and Kilmarnock.
- Continued use of Lottery, GoCardless, Tap to Donate and Easy Fundraising.
- Successful grants from NLCF, Bank of Scotland, GCVS, Albert Hunt, SIA, Robertson Trust, Virgin and Merchants House.
- University placement provider - Queen Margaret University paramedic program - 5 students
- Events covered - TRNSMT Festival and Balloch Sports Day 2024.
- New recruitment system launched - Qintil.
- Successful Doors Open Day and Photograph Exhibit.
- One Year pilot of our first paid member of staff started in December 2024.
- New Patient Portal System launching 2025.
- ProCloud Launching (2025).

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

During the period, total incoming resources amounted to £115,850. The total outgoing resources amounted to £66,391. This resulted in a surplus for the year of £49,459.

Reserves policy

Unrestricted funds: these consist of funds which are available to the charity to use in furtherance of achieving its objectives.

The unrestricted fund balance of £41,842 represents the free reserves of the charity arising from operating results.

The trustees would like to apply "best practice" and have free reserves at a level which would cover at least three months operating activity.

Restricted funds are those to which income has been received with the condition that it be reserved for a particular purpose. During the period, a total of £80,550 has been classed as restricted income.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

The structure of the organisation consists of:-

- the Members - who have the right to attend members' meetings (including any annual general meeting) and have important powers under the constitution; in particular, the members appoint people to serve on the board.

- the Board - who hold regular meetings, and generally control the organisational activities (non day-to-day activities) of the organisation; for example, the board is responsible for monitoring and improving the financial position of the organisation.

- the Employees - who hold a paid position, and control the organisational day-to-day activities of the organisation; for example, operational staffing, operational equipment management, Human Resources related activities, this list is not exhaustive.

The people serving on the board are referred to in this constitution as charity trustees. The members are referred to in this constitution as volunteers.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

At each AGM, the members may elect any member (unless they are debarred from membership under clause 57) to be a charity trustee.

The board may at any time appoint any member (unless they are debarred from membership under clause 57) to be a charity trustee.

At each AGM, all of the charity trustees elected/appointed under clauses 59 and 60 (and, in the case of the first AGM, those deemed to have been appointed under clause 58) shall retire from office - but shall then be eligible for re-election under clause 59.

A charity trustee retiring at an AGM will be deemed to have been re-elected unless:-

- they advise the board prior to the conclusion of the AGM that they do not wish to be re-appointed as a charity trustee; or
- an election process was held at the AGM, and they were not among those elected/re-elected through that process; or
- a resolution for the re-election of that charity trustee was put to the AGM and was not carried.

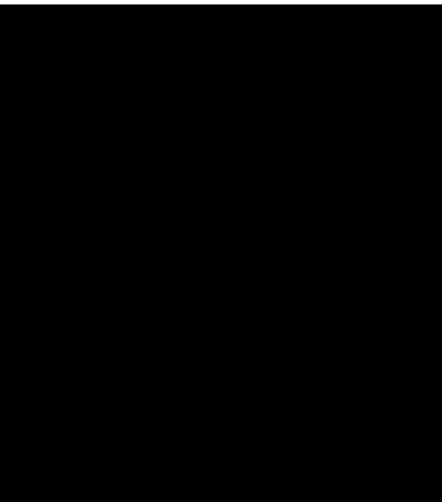

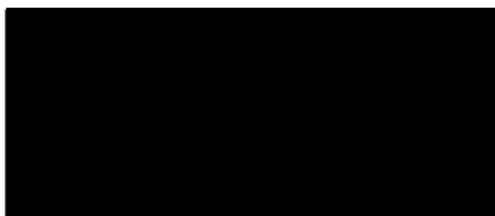
Basis of the independent examiner's report

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery - 10% - 25% on a straight line basis

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
