What the charity does: We are a large, friendly community garden in the heart of Tullibody. We provide volunteering opportunities that develop gardening, cooking, social and vocational skills. Our volunteers come from all walks of life - all come to grow fresh produce in a climate-friendly way and to make affordable, local, garden grown fresh fruit and vegetables available to our wider community. We have a kitchen portacabin on site and that makes us uniquely placed to make connections between growing and cooking - from 'fork to plate'. We run gardening and cookery workshops and hold community open days where we provide all resources eg compost, seeds, ingredients, recipes. Many of the cookery sessions we run are 'cooking on a budget' or for total beginners. Through our sessional gardener and cook we deliver educational activities to local nursery and primary schools. college groups and other community organisations.

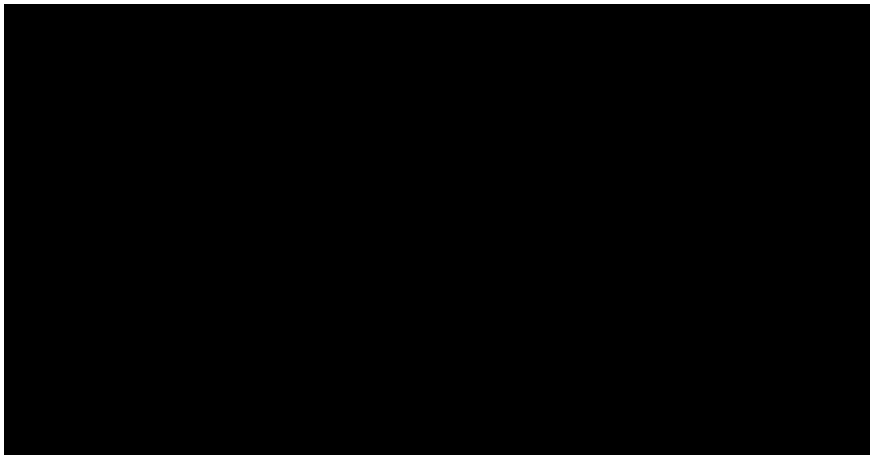

FEL, with Scotland's International Environment Centre, awarded us a Climate Action grant to pay a consultant to design us an environmentally friendly drainage scheme. A great first step in tackling our ongoing flooding issues.

New Lease/Council - We were delighted to hear that our landlords, Clacks Council, are going to secure our future at Carseview by offering us a 25-year lease. This is vital for applying for future funding. We also work with other departments in the

Council such as their Unpaid work squad who continue to help with mowing and strimming.

TCV continue their close links with us, their 'Green Gym' group coming regularly to carry out invaluable practical tasks on the garden and wildlife area. Using our Earth Action grant they helped plant pollinator friendly shrubs in the wildlife area.

Stirling University- have put up pollinator meters in our wildflower and raised beds. Pollinating insects play a vital role in our environment, ensuring that many of our crops and wild plants can set seed and produce fruit.

Tullibody Community Development Trust - by working together we have provided fruit and vegetables for their toddler groups and lunch club.

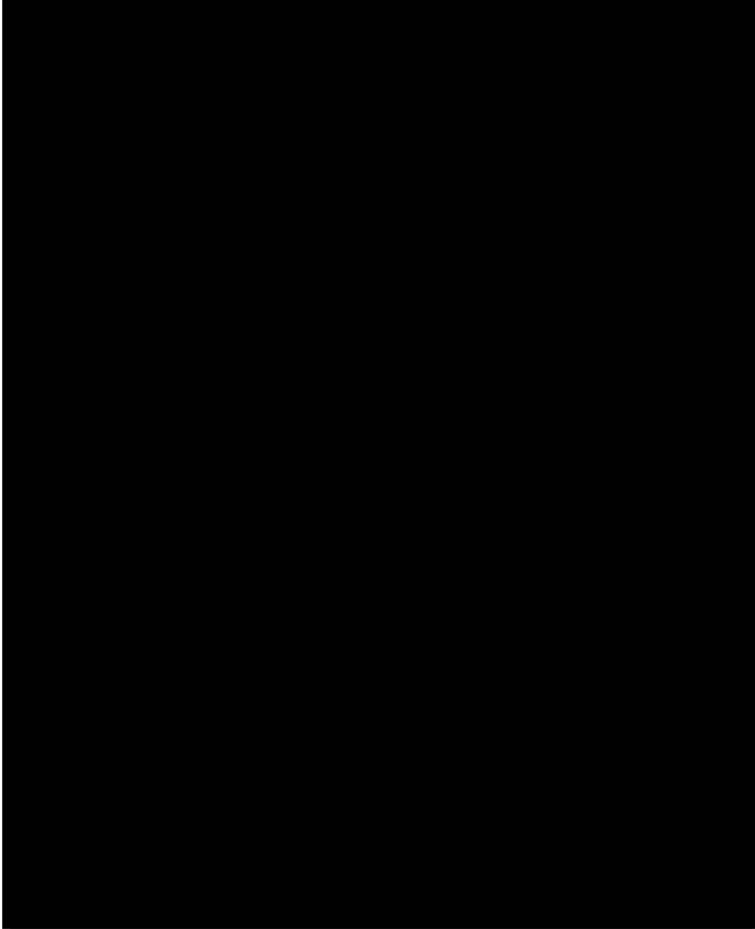
With **CTSI** and **The Gate** - we again took part in **Challenge Poverty Week**.

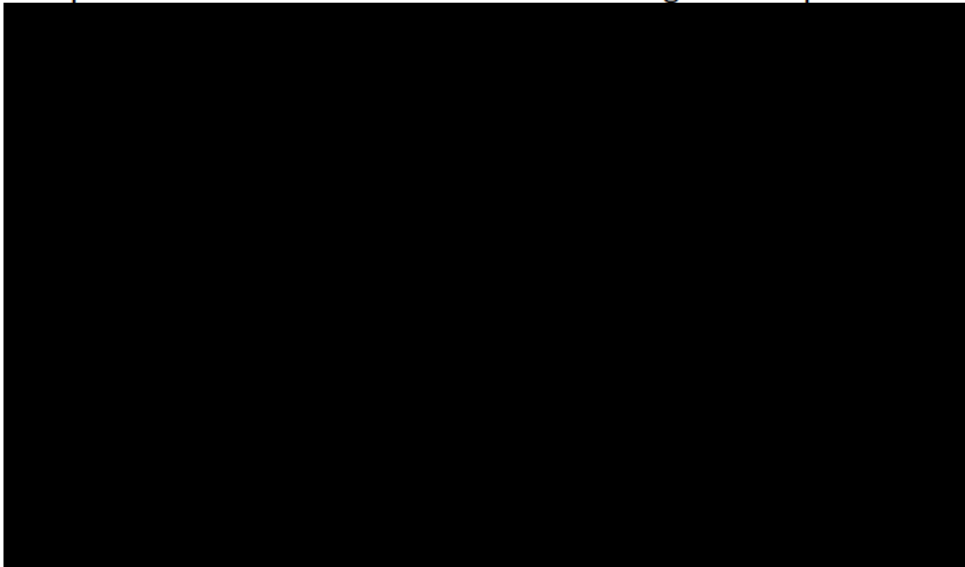


Hawkhill Community Centre- we take part in local events, we set up an information stall for “**Tullibody Community Garden**” and providing children activities



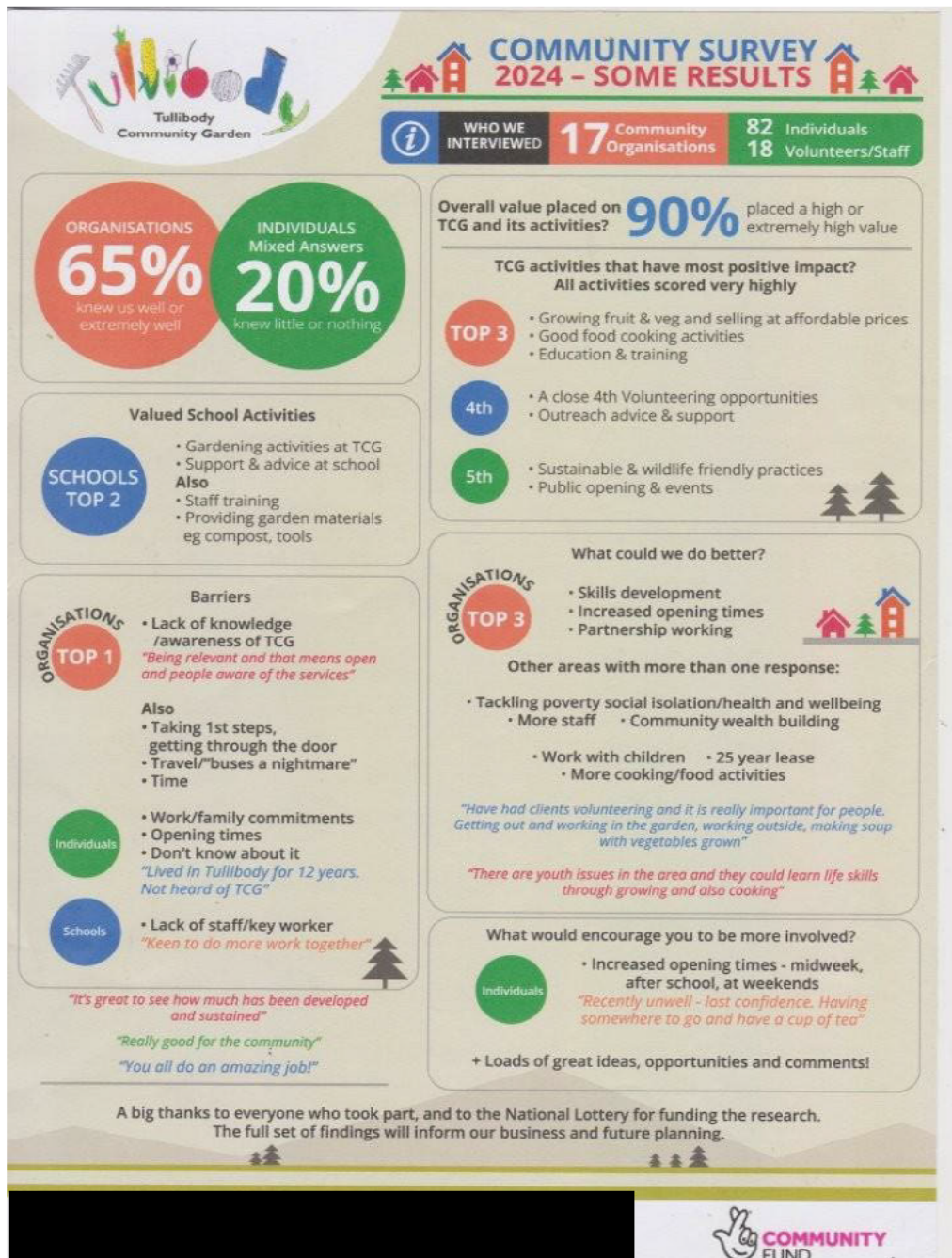
Education- we continue to work with our local schools and nurseries to gain opportunities to learn outside about nature and where food comes from.
