Chairperson's Report

Why was the Charity set up?

LIVING HOPE (Skye and Lochalsh) SCIO, was set up to formalise the recovery work of [REDACTED] which had originally been operating under an Unincorporated Association 'Haven Ministries' and then as Living Hope from 2019. [REDACTED] had been providing one-to-one mentoring and recovery group work for people affected by alcohol and substance use. LIVING HOPE (Skye and Lochalsh) was registered as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) on 5th May 2021.

Who does LIVING HOPE (Skye and Lochalsh) help?

Primarily, LIVING HOPE (Skye and Lochalsh) offers support to people from Skye and Lochalsh. New referrals or requests for advice generally come from word of mouth, personal contacts, NHS staff, Criminal Justice Social workers, Citizen's Advice Bureau, schools and youth clubs.

Information sharing intervention with young people is preventative in purpose. Support is available for individuals at varying levels of substance use from those in crisis to those well on the road to full recovery. There is also support for family members struggling with supporting someone with related issues.

The Lighthouse Café provides a venue for people who are being directly supported by Living Hope to drop-in and meet in a comfortable place as well as reducing social isolation for all members of the community providing reasonably priced, or free, food through the 'Pay it forward' scheme, in a relaxed environment. Currently other local charities, the Mental Health Association and Young Carers, use the building on a weekly basis as they have for many years.

WHAT was done: outputs, outcomes and impact

- This year, 2023-24, the Living Hope project has continued to be managed by [REDACTED] with volunteers and some staff working in the Café. We also a fund raiser for a few months.
- [REDACTED] has continued to run "Road to Recovery" meetings each week in "The Lighthouse" using a twelve step based programme. Many of original members have now moved forward with their lives and are successfully holding down regular work.
- [REDACTED] has continued to maintain contacts and network with other national Recovery organisations and has been able to encourage links for local group members through visits to other projects and online meetings, with positive outcomes.

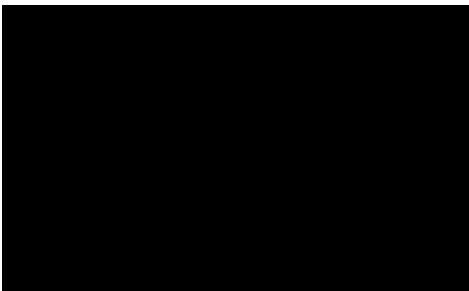
- Outreach work has continued with people currently supported by home visits, phone calls, meetings and drop-ins.
- [REDACTED] continues to support local people by being present at local court appearances and through prison visits and rehab visits.
- [REDACTED] has received more invitations to share in the local high school, both from the perspective of third sector awareness and to give drugs awareness presentations.
- “The Lighthouse” building in Kyle of Lochalsh, has so far proved successful in furthering the work of the charity, as a venue for meetings, as well as giving benefit to the wider public. The Café has been open 3 days per week attracting a number of regular users who benefit from the regular social interaction. It has also provided finances to pay for at least one member of staff, improving employability.
- Some regular users have gained a sense of ownership of the place, which has involved them in offering to help maintain the building. The building itself has thereby been of help in building a mutually supportive group.
- The cafe drop-in during the week has continued to be useful to [REDACTED] as a neutral venue in which to meet people who are on the first step of seeking support with substance misuse. Sometimes they have entered to make use of the free food ‘pay it forward’ scheme and in doing so have engaged with support.
- Christian worship and fellowship meetings have continued two Sunday afternoons per month. Providing an opportunity for outside speakers to visit and share their recovery stories, which have encouraged the attendees.
- Other local charities, Skye & Lochalsh Mental Health Association, Young Carers and Lochalsh Youth Trust have continued to benefit from using the Lighthouse building.
- Community support such as Alzheimer’s Scotland and the local Housing Associations have hosted drop ins in the Café.

Moving Forward:

The board of “Living Hope (Skye and Lochalsh)” recognise the benefits of the “Lighthouse” building to the charity and this will continue as long as funds allow.

[REDACTED] received more invitations this year to speak to other groups around the country and these interconnections and relationships are helpful and strengthening both to these groups and to Living Hope group members.

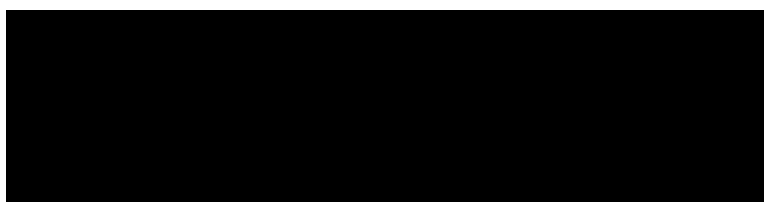
In the course of my examination, no matter has come to my attention

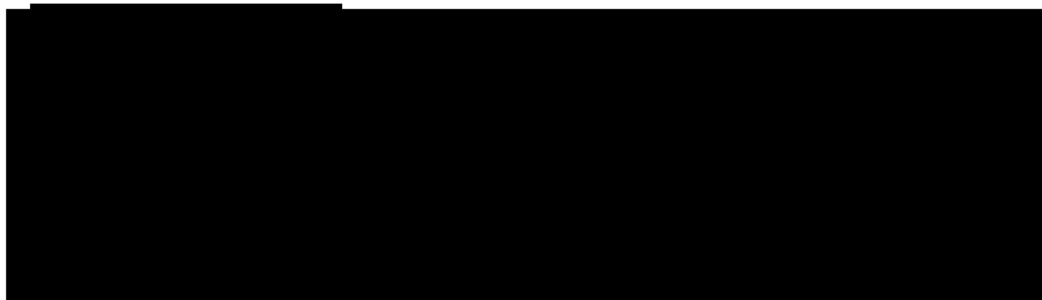
