APPENDIX 1

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

The charity continued to receive gifts from individuals, churches and organizations. Mostly from those who are clients of the company.

Gifts were made to 5 individuals or organisations who needed the leaflets but were considered not to have the resources to afford them themselves. They included outreaches in Republic of Ireland and border areas, Stoyan Stoyanov in Bulgaria (3 gifts), Helping Hands and Belfast City Mission.

A legacy receipt of £20,000 was given to the company as a loan in order to allow the company to invest in new equipment for literature production.

The company continues to function providing literature to those who can afford it.

Financial review

All reserves are retained in cash form to provide funding for future activities. There are no defined upper or lower limits on reserves held but it is the policy of the Trustees to plan activities consistent with the availability of reserves for funding purposes.
