Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of IS Education Europe SC050979

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024 which are set out on pages 1 and 2.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities. Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the 2006 Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

The site includes pages for educators and the general public, offering insights into the condition, its symptoms, and its impact on learning. There are useful resources aimed at educational professionals including:

- A blog article on "Top Strategies for Teachers of Irlen Syndrome Pupils";
- Two downloadable assets related to academic research findings;
- A free-to-download PDF booklet about Irlen Syndrome which parents can share with their children's teachers;

Supporting Educational Resources:

We have created a range of free-to-download materials, including:

- Guidance on classroom adjustments to support students with Irlen Syndrome.
- Informative resources for teachers to recognise symptoms and implement effective strategies.

Email Campaigns:

ISEE has conducted targeted email campaigns directed at teachers across the UK. These campaigns focus on raising awareness of Irlen Syndrome symptoms and include links to our website sections on strategies to support affected pupils in classroom settings.

Social Media Engagement:

The charity maintains an active presence on LinkedIn (166 followers) and Facebook (96 followers), regularly sharing informative posts and updates to further educate the public and educators. All our engagement has been achieved organically without the use of paid advertising.

Research Collaboration: ISEE was approached by Strathclyde University (Summer 2024) to explore potential research collaboration related to Irlen Syndrome. We are currently awaiting further details and the proposed project scope before determining our level of involvement.
