**What the charity does:** We are set up to offer first aid training to the community and provide First Aid provision to local community events. Our volunteers are trained to FREC level 3 and attend various different events within the local community providing first aid cover. We have attended Turriff Show, Keith Show, Aberdeen Kilt Walk, Duftown Games, Aberlour Games to name just a few. We have covered over 40 events this current year. We have 2 fully equipped ambulances and a response ambulance car. We have teams in Cullen, Elgin, Aviemore and a Central Belt team.

**Objectives:** 4. 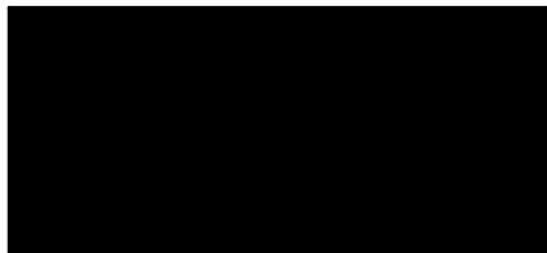

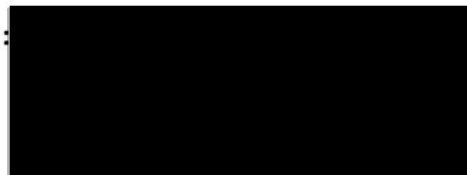

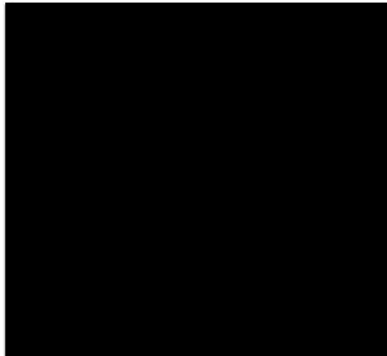

**Constitution**

Event First Aid Service (Scotland) is governed by its constitution which was accepted by OSCR on 11 June 2021.

**Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees**

One third of the Trustees shall retire at each Annual General Meeting (but shall be eligible for re-election) with those longest in office retiring first. The charity members are responsible for electing Committee members to replace those who are retiring.

**Charitable Purpose**

Event First Aid Service (Scotland) was created to provide the following charitable purpose:  
The advancement of education, the advancement of health and the saving of lives, all through education and training in first aid; the treatment of illness, rescue, accident prevention and similar activities primarily at public events such as Highland Games, Agricultural Shows and sporting events.

**Activities and Achievements**

The 2024 season was once again a very busy one with 44 events covered, ranging from a small village picnic to Turriff show, and a huge variety in between. A large number of our events are now coming in through our website, and we also covered events from Ayr in the south to Dornoch in the north, making us a truly Scotland wide organisation.

In November we contracted [REDACTED] to structure and write up all the policy documents E.F.A.S has a legal requirement for. I would like to record a vote of thanks to [REDACTED] for all his hard work and diligence in this considerable undertaking.

E.F.A.S updated volunteers work wear including lined, waterproof jackets for all our First Aiders. Recruitment continues to be an issue for us, although we are working hard to resolve this, including a more pro-active approach at events. The Elgin team now meets in the Bishopmill hall on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month and have a solid, dependable core of volunteers. Central belt group is growing, slowly but surely under the guidance of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] They have set up a what's app group which seems to be working well, and they are covering a growing number of events in their area, as well as helping us fulfil a large number of events in the north.

E.F.A.S now has 3 response vehicles in the fleet, a Mercedes Sprinter, a Renault Master (both front line ambulances) and a Hynudai 140 Estate First Aid response vehicle.

A decision that all our First Aiders should be trained and qualified to First Responder Emergency Care (F.R.E.C.) level 3, which will become a minimum requirement for Event First Aid providers. This process is now under way.

**Financial Review**

The charity has achieved total income for the year of £31,115 (2023 £56,245) derived mainly from grants, donations and fundraising activities .

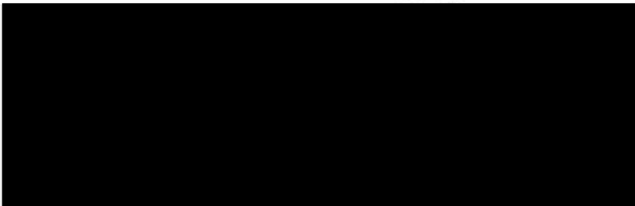
Expenditure totals £45,170 (2023 £51,519) for the year, giving an overall net (deficit)/surplus of (£14,055), (2023 £4,726) being carried from/ to reserves.

At the year end total reserves were £9,736, all of which were unrestricted.

**Reserves policy**

The Statement of Balances shows funds at the year end of £9,736 (2023 - £23,791) which are held by the charity for use in future charitable events and activities.

**Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Event First Aid Service (Scotland)**

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2024 which are set out on pages 5 to 7.

**Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiners**

The Charity's Trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The charity Trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

**Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement**

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the Trustees concerning any such matters. 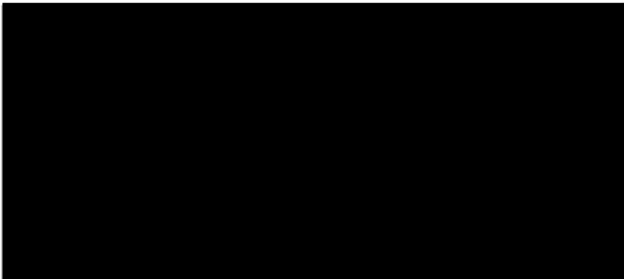
