Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2025

The Trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2025.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the Primrose Community Trust in the year under review was that of advancing community support and development. This is centred on community well-being, welfare, sport & recreation and health and fitness and progressing the creation of opportunities for all community members.

TRUSTEES

The Trustees shown below have held office during the whole of the year ended 31 March 2024 to the date of this report.



The trustees hold no beneficial interest.

These accounts have been prepared on the Accrual basis in accordance with the Charities & Trustee Investment (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

Constitution

The Primrose Community Trust is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 29th June 2021. It has a two-tier constitution, based on the SCVO SCIO two tier model constitution and as such, members have a range of important rights including the right to appoint people to serve on the board at the annual general meeting.

Appointment of Trustees

The management committee, which normally meets fortnightly, are the charity's trustees. Membership of the management committee is open to anyone with an interest in promoting the advancement of the organisation's purposes. Trustees are elected at the annual general meeting scheduled for April. There must be a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 7 trustees.

Charitable Purposes

The Primrose Community Trust's purposes are:

- The advancement of education.
- The advancement of public participation in sport.
- The advancement of citizenship and community development

ACTIVITIES

The Primrose Community Trust's activities are

- Encourage public participation in a wide range of sports including football.
- Advance education through a learning and development facility.
- Advance community support and development in the area.

- Development of youth & community initiatives
- Development of fitness, health, and nutrition
- Organisation of welfare initiatives including foodbank & fuel fund support.

These are progressed through our aim of help make people's lives' better by providing facilities for all ages and interests. By providing a focus on physical, mental (including emotional health and wellbeing), education, sport and recreation, community heritage and interests, planned activities, the promotion of equality and diversity, welfare, cultural, social, and local needs. Essentially, our values are "Crossgates for All".

The Primrose Community Trust aims to deliver improvements to;

- Education in support of pre-school and school age children and further education in adults.
- Health through availability of local sporting and activity facilities for all ages, interests, and abilities.
- Community social interaction through enhanced opportunities to bring people together.
- Community welfare provisions through meeting places for groups providing assistance such as a foodbank, free meals, and community support.
- Mental health by reducing loneliness and isolation through the provision of locally available facilities.
- Career opportunities through the introduction of an advice centre in employment.
- Providing assistance in social welfare via co-ordinating food bank and fuel fund service provisions.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The reserve fund for 2025 is £17,802 (2024 - £83,722) and represents unrestricted funds of £(21,811). The reserve fund is reviewed annually to ensure it will continue to meet our requirements. The trustees are satisfied that the current funds should be sufficient to cover 3 months operational costs to meet the contractual obligations to clients should funding be withdrawn.

PLANS FOR FUTURE ACTIVITIES

In line with Scottish Government guidance, Fife Council and local community protocols, the Primrose Community Trust have plans in place for an increased return to face to face engagement activities later next year. We will adopt a blended approach to delivering services involving both face-to-face gatherings alongside some continued online activities in order to meet the needs of the widest possible range of individuals.

We aim to deliver on all our 'Pillars of Activity'.

- Community Engagement
- Sport & Recreation
- Health, Fitness & Nutrition
- Heritage & Education
- Youth & Children's Development
- Welfare

Each individual project above requires clear aims and objectives and precise outcomes and deliverables identified. Clear action plans and measured reporting, culminating on the integrated benefits to the whole community. We will continue to support and promote the existing welfare provisions provided with a focus on the food bank and fuel fund provisions. We will continue to focus on fundraising activities to raise more capital for this critical and exciting project.

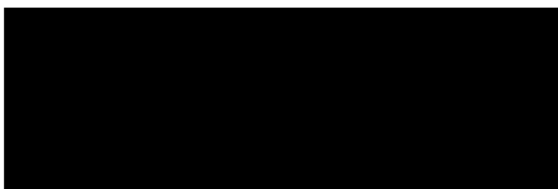
The members have not required the charity to obtain an audit of its financial statements for the period ended 31 March 2025 in accordance with Section 476 of the Companies Act 2006.

1. **STATUTORY INFORMATION**

Primrose Community Trust is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation, registered in Scotland. The charity's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Charity Information page.

2. **ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) that applies the provisions of Section 1A "Small Entities" of Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The Trustees are of the view that the immediate future of the Charity is secured and on this basis the assessment of the Trustees is that the Charity remains a going concern.

Nature and Purpose of Funds

Unrestricted funds are those that may be used at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. The trustees maintain a single unrestricted fund for the day-to-day running of the charity.

Restricted funds may only be used for specific purposes. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for specific purposes.

Report of the Accountants to the Trustees of Primrose Community Trust

I, [REDACTED] IFA FIPA FFTA, report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2025, which are set out on pages one to six.

Responsibilities and basis of report

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) 2005 Act and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The charity trustees consider that the *audit requirement* of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply.
