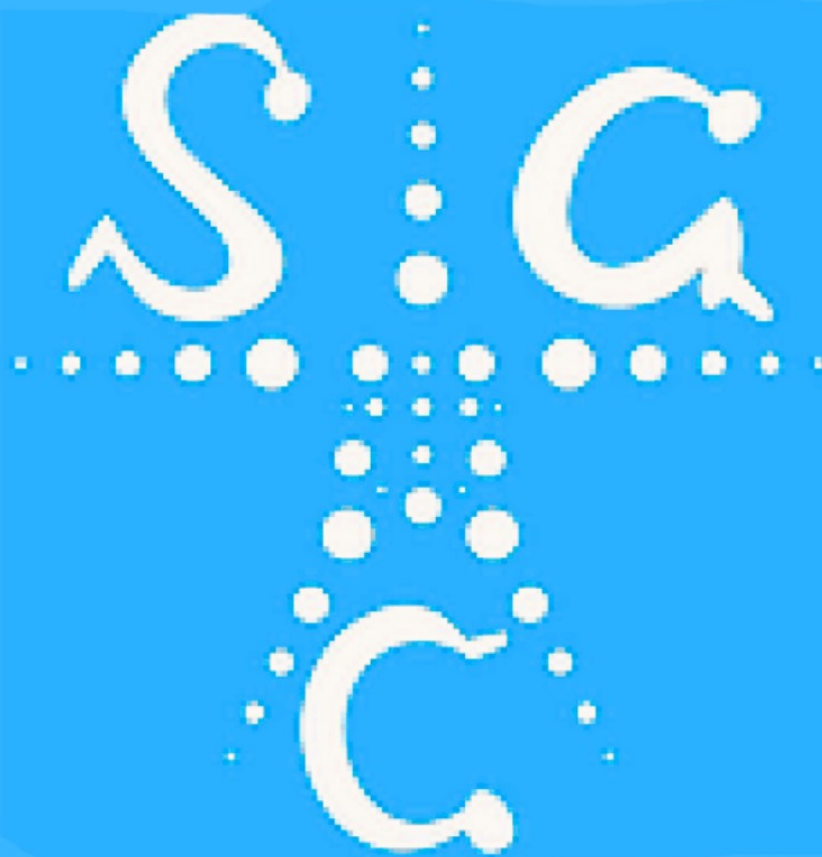

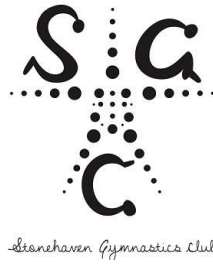

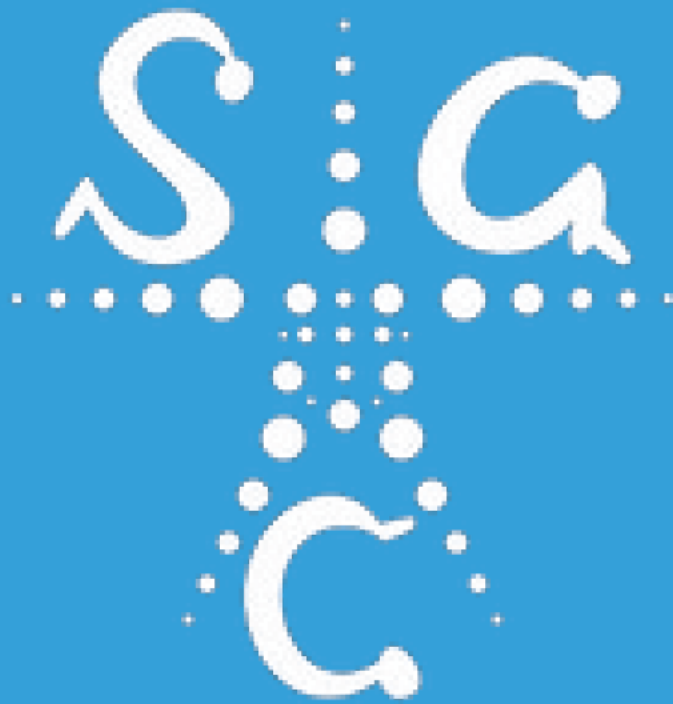

Seven of our gymnasts competed at the Scottish Classic Challenge in Perth. Our club earned a top 10 place in Vaults.

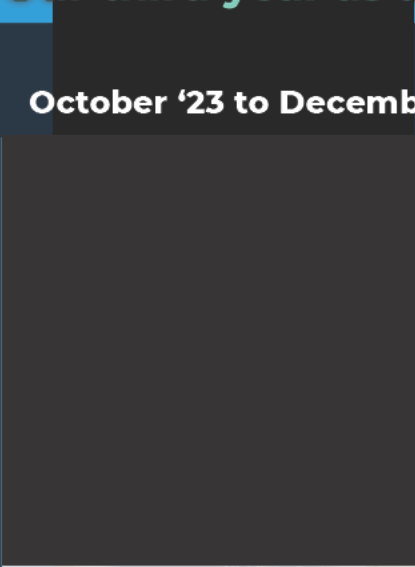

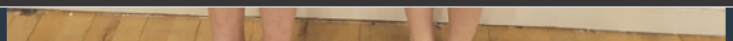
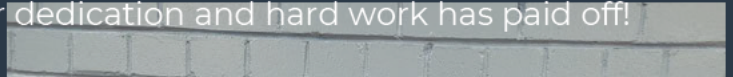
January '24 to March '24

We are all hugely proud of our gymnasts, their dedication and hard work has paid off!



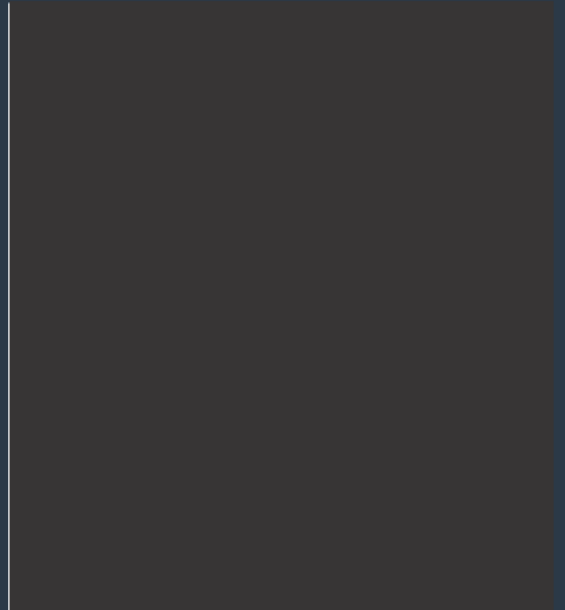
