TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing Document

Spit it Out SCIO was registered as a charity with the Office of the Scottish Regulator (OSCR) on the 21st July 2021. It became Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) on this date and is governed by its constitution.

Appointment of Trustees

The Board which meets regularly throughout the year, are the charity trustees. The trustees are appointed by the membership at the Annual General Meeting (AGM). During the year the trustees may co-opt other trustees to serve on the board twice per annum if they believe it is in the interest of the charity to do so. All trustees retire at the AGM but are eligible for re-election. The constitution allows for a minimum of three and a maximum of eleven.

Organisation Structure

The trustees are responsible for the strategic direction and governance of the charity. There are members of the charity who are able to attend meetings and do have certain voting powers, however they have no liability to pay any sums to meet the organisation debt.

ACHIEVEMENTS & PERFORMANCE

Spit it Out is an award-winning Scottish based organisation dedicated to opening conversations around consent, mental health and healing through creativity and community care. We realise the overarching goals of our project through collaborating with our community in delivering free activities in Edinburgh, Glasgow and online. We work to create lasting change in our community and create a support network with people who feel isolated and who have experienced trauma and mental health crises.

The organisation was founded to originally centre the voices of vulnerable groups and cultivate empathy between divergent communities. Spit it Out was awarded the “Celebrating diversity” award from the Epic Awards in 2020, organised by Creative Lives. It was also nominated by Creative Edinburgh for the “Inclusion” and “Community” awards in 2022. The Spit It Out collective is entirely formed of women and nonbinary people, the majority of which are neurodiverse, with 70% black and people of colour representation and 80% LGBTQIA+ representation,

Our Outcomes

The SIO audience:

- feels less lonely thanks to a community that recognises their needs and the issues important to them.
- feels more empowered to express their experiences through the medium of their choice.
- learn new techniques to better support their own and others' mental health.
- learn new skills they can use in their personal and professional lives.

The general public:

- has a better knowledge of ways to support marginalised groups.
- has an understanding of alternative routes to care and crisis support, separate from state.

- **AYE THRIVE**

We organise monthly marginalised-led workshops where we invite people from the community to join us for an evening where they can learn in a safe and trauma-informed environment.

- **AYE CONNECT**

Monthly meet-ups for the community: we invite people from the community to join us for an evening of discussions, games and activities. We believe the meet-ups have allowed members of our community to feel less alone and to feel welcome and safe through this initiative.

- **AYE SHARE**

We organise creative events with live performances and open mics.

We realised that it was more important than ever to use our platform to give opportunities to black and people of colour and queer performers. We curate our events with this priority in mind and it is always a huge success.

- **AYE BREATHE**

We work with vulnerable adults who have experienced trauma and mental health crises. We wanted to create a programme that would be accessible to all and would bring a community together through outdoor activities.

- **THE SPIT IT OUT FESTIVAL**

We provided a fortnight of immersive mental health and arts festival across Glasgow, Edinburgh and online.

- **AYE RIGHT**
We invite the community to meet and discuss sensitive topics. We educate ourselves and the participants on different ways to help our community to find accountability and to heal.
- **THE PODCAST**
The Spit it Out podcast invites members of the community to share their experience anonymously, giving them tools to use their personal experience as an activism tool to help others.
- **THE PHLEGM MAGAZINE**
A platform for people to express themselves through art that centres on difficult topics. We aim to educate and inform people about these topics, such as boy neutrality, sex, trauma and depression.
- **Specialised Support**
Our goal is to give paid opportunities and training opportunities to our community, helping them realise their strengths and how to use them in their professional and personal lives.

Collaborations and Partnerships

We created partnerships with over 40 organisations, collectives, individuals and venues all around the world in order to deliver and expand our work.

FINANCIAL REVIEW


Charity income for the period stated is £176,792 (2022-£77,055) and expenditure of £147,313 (2022-£65,369), leaving surplus of £29,479 (2022-£11,686). Unrestricted funds of £15,420 (2022-£7,324) and restricted of £25,745 (2022-4,362), grand total of £41,165 (2022-£11686).

Reserves Policy

The trustees' policy is to maintain sufficient reserves to meet operating costs of running events as they occur.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

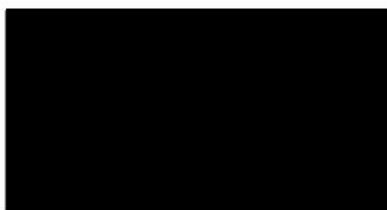
