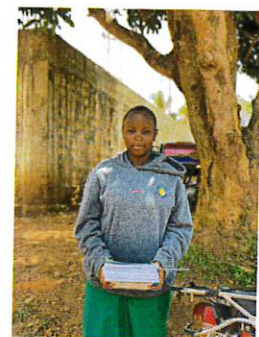
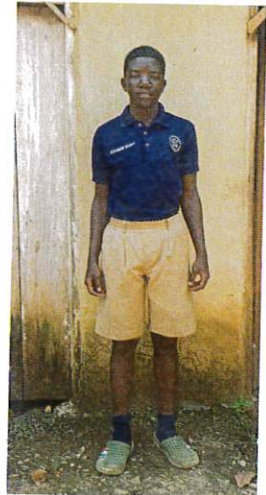

Vincent's family had fallen on hard times and were not able to pay for him to go to school. Thanks to a very kind donation from Templeton Bowling Club's annual charity bowling match Vincent was able to finish primary 7 and move into first year at High School with his fees covered for 2025

We're celebrating Calvin, who achieved top grades in Primary Leaving Exams and is now moving into Senior 1 at "Sam's High School"

We are thrilled that Ronitah successfully sat and passed her O Levels finishing in the top set – an excellent result as she moves into her second year of high school, senior 5.

The Boys 2 Men and Dignity programmes, run by Youth Consult, have also continued throughout the school holidays - helping our high school students navigate life with the support of mentors, Bible teaching, and of course, plenty of fun along the way.

We were also able to keep our tradition before Christmas of giving each of the Siyabonga youth a food parcel for them and their families.

Siyabonga Building Project

In 2022 we received funding to start a building project from Adullam Inc, a charity registered in the USA and Scotland (SC046023). Adullam Inc has been faithful in their giving over the last 3/4 years and have provided the majority of the funding to get the building to the stage it is at today.

The building is on land owned by Siyabonga Milele Africa (Godfrey Lwanyaga is also Trustee of this charity in Uganda) in Wakiso, Kampala, Uganda.

Our plan for this building is to have a place that can be used as an office space, for respite, camps and workshops for the children and young people we support. We will also have a meeting space which can be hired out.

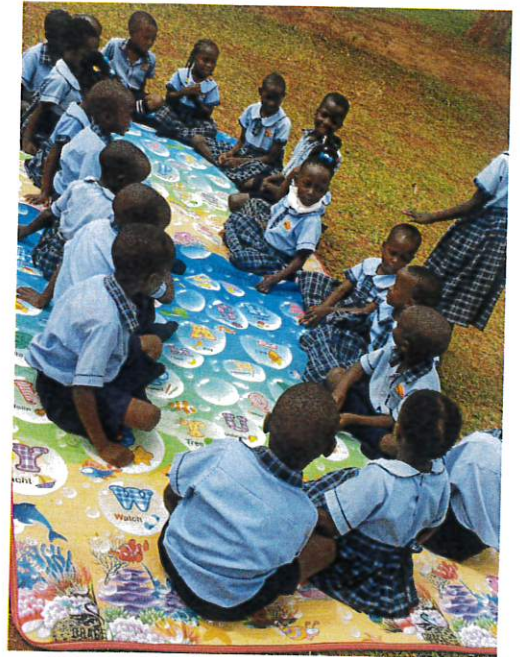
Part of our purpose is to bless the community around our projects, and with this in mind, the well in the grounds of the building has two tanks so we are able to let the surrounding community use one of these.

From laying foundations at the start of 2023 and sinking a well, we are now almost at completion! In 2024/2025 the structure was fully built with roof and majority of windows in place, electricity, internet and our own water supply. Part of the building is already being used as an office space for the Youth Consult team, and, the remaining painting and tiling will be finished in 2026 when we can then start to use the building to its full potential.

Butambala Nursery – formerly known as *The School Under the Tree* – has continued to thrive and grow over the last few years.

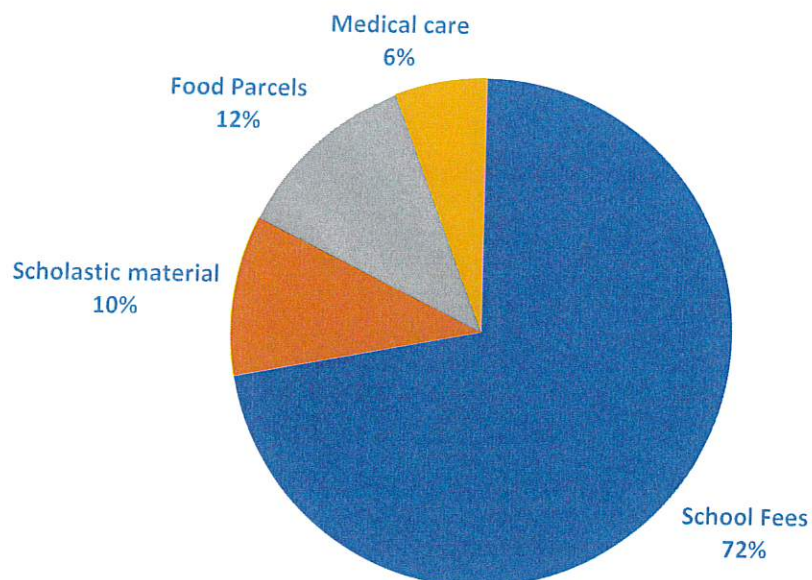
In 2024/25 we started with 34 children registered, 2 teachers and a head teacher. The children's day is packed with lessons and fun and importantly they have 2 meals a day. Although the school now has a classroom for the children with tables and chairs, lessons outside are still a part of the school day!

We had a generous donation from one of our sponsors to provide the children with Mosquito nets to help curb malaria outbreaks.

We continued with our tradition of providing the families with food parcels at Christmas – Santa even made an appearance!

In 2026 our building project will be largely complete. The building has electricity, water and internet and is already being used as an office space for the Youth Consult team. Our next steps will be to employ a live-in caretaker and start to use the space for workshops to help young people develop skills for employment e.g sewing, hairdressing etc. We also hope to use the building for youth camps and respite.

We will continue to support the children we have going through education by paying for their school fees, scholastic materials and meeting any other needs as they arise.

We are also excited to help Butambala Nursey continue to grow. We have a vision to further expand the school to ultimately have space for children at nursery level, preschool and from primaries 1 through to 7. We will be looking to fundraise for this building work, for all of the classroom fixtures and fittings and for additional teachers and helpers. The number of children registered at the start of 2026 has tripled from last year and will continue to grow each year.

We are looking forward to all the next year has in store for us and will share updates on our Facebook page and our website.

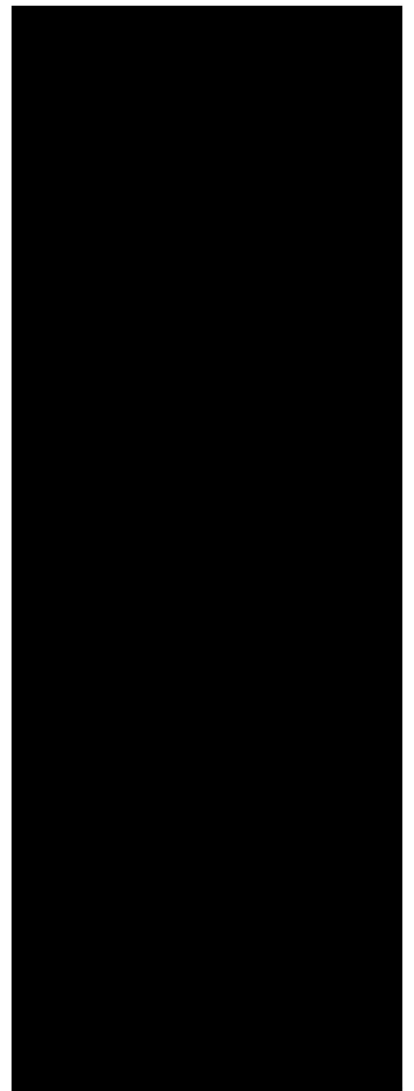
Achievements and Performance

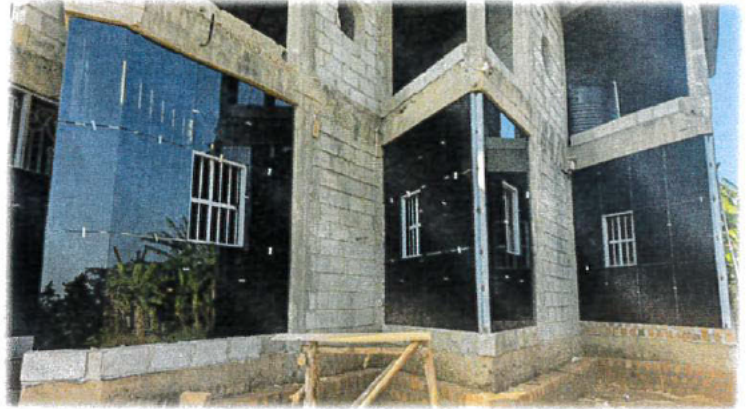

We met with a former Siyabonga youth - [REDACTED] who finished his higher studies and is now working as a plumber. More of these follow up visits are in place to check in with previous students supported by Siyabonga to keep in touch with them and to see how their education and studies have helped them and how they are being put into practice.

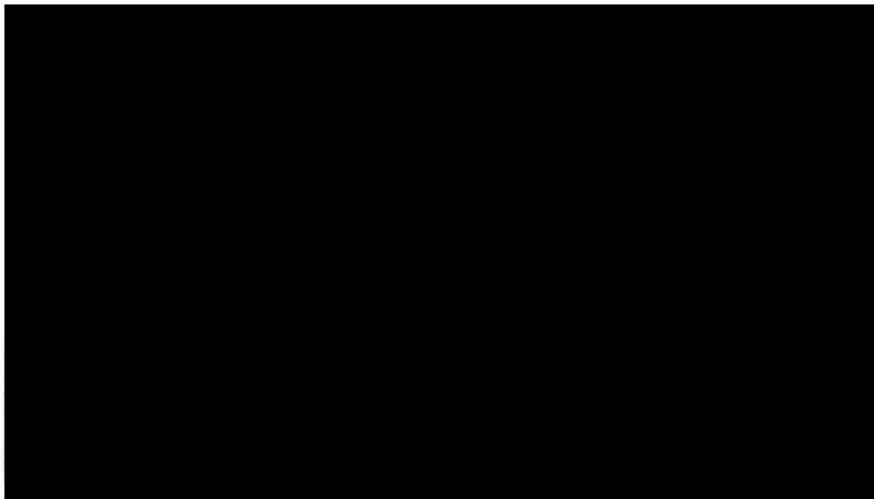

From laying foundations at the start of 2023 and sinking a well, we are really now seeing our vision come to life. The structure is now fully built with roof and windows in place. The interior still needs a lot of work, but the building is wind and water tight with plans to start using it in 2025.

Part of our purpose is to bless the community around our projects, and with this in mind, the well in the grounds of the building has two tanks so we are able to let the surrounding community use one of these.

We now have a separate account set up for any giving that is specifically for the building work.





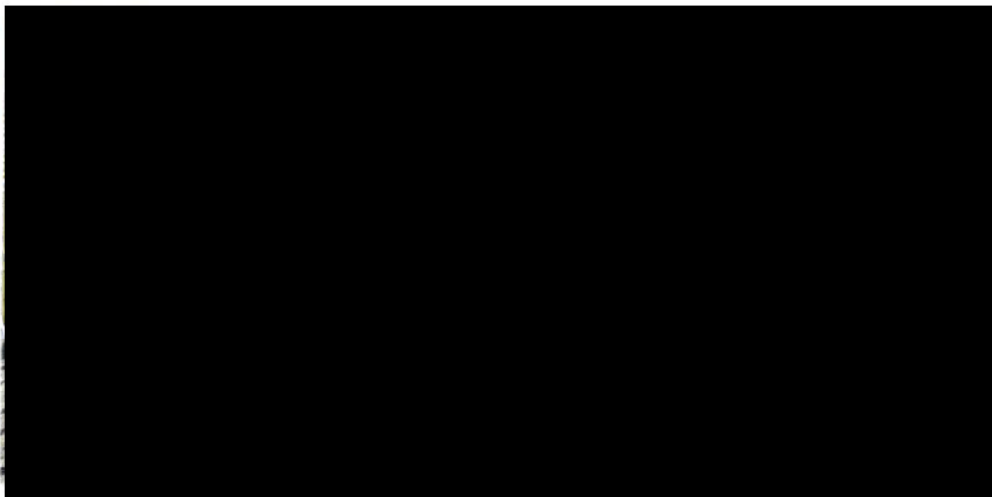
Butambala Nursery – formerly known as *The School Under the Tree* – has really grown and developed over the past year. You can see that the children have a colourful school building with chairs and desks so lessons and breaks can be taken out of the elements.

The school now has a full-time teacher and the children have a morning snack and a full meal provided in their school day.

Following a kind donation, we were also able to provide some musical instruments – and their drumming can be heard throughout the village!

We continued with our tradition of providing the families with food parcels at Christmas.

Boys to Men Program



The goal of the program is to nurture emotionally intelligent, self-aware and purpose driven young men.

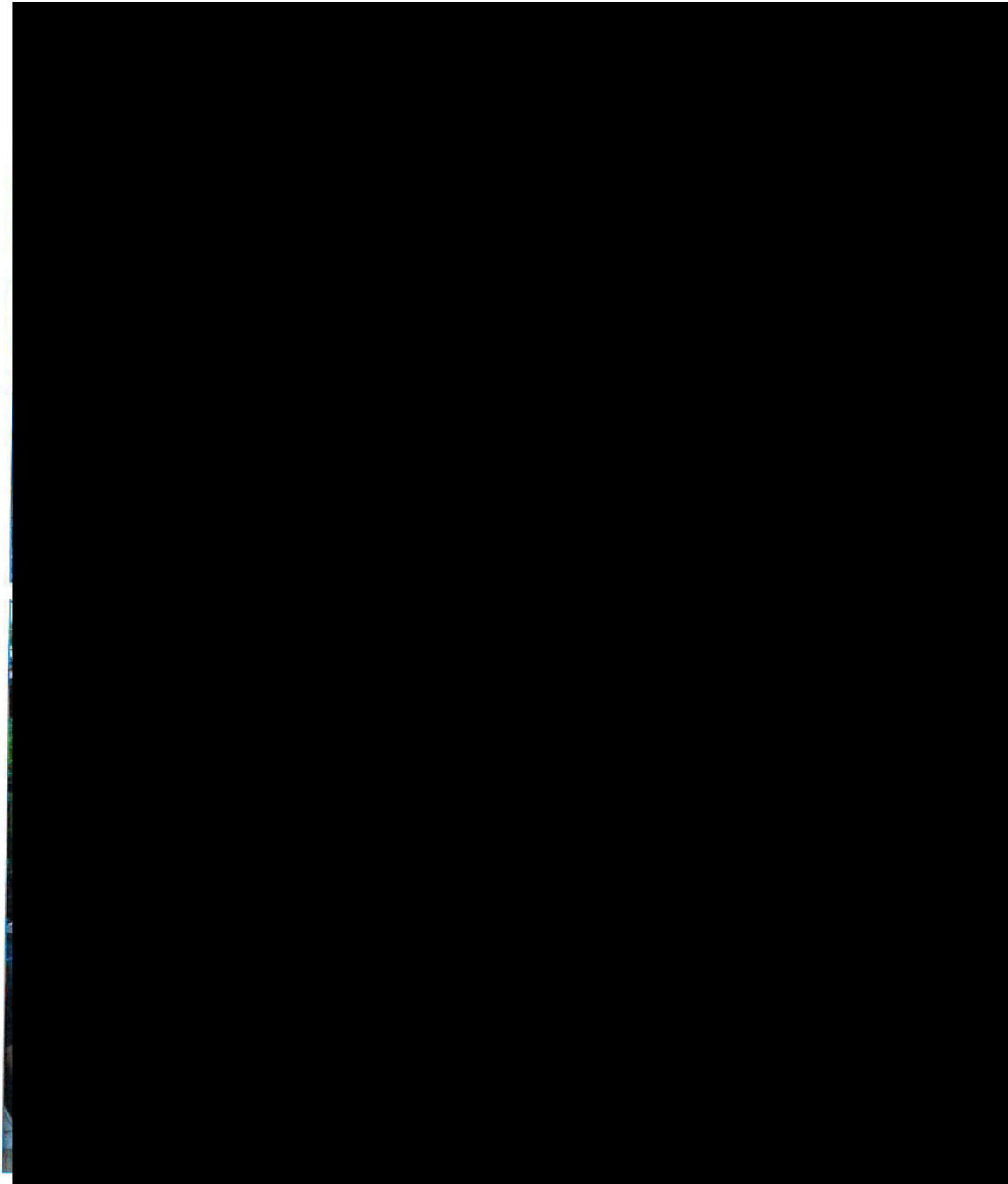
The specific program objectives entail;

- Promoting self-awareness and identity formation.
- Enhancing focus and goal setting skills
- Building confidence and positive self-image
- Guiding boys in decision making and resilience

In 2024, the activities we undertook included; engagement and counselling sessions under themes of identity and focus. We worked with a total of 108 boys all through the three sessions. The sessions revolved around; mental power and responsibility as men. We shared a meal as we talked through the challenges of the day and generated solutions.

Youth Camp

In January, 2024 we held an educational youth camp under the theme *"Me, Myself and I - It starts with me!"* The four-day residential camp had a total of 40 participants. A series of topical sessions were tackled including; self – reflection, financial discipline, goal setting, visioning and career guidance. The sessions were built around fun games, dance battles and various camping activities. Overall, the participants gave us feedback this has been the best educational camp they had been to.



Future plans

In 2024/2025 we will continue the work on our building. We are at a stage now where the building is being used by office staff and the wells are in use for both the team and the community. We will focus on the completion of the interior and the fixtures and fittings.

We will continue to support the children we have going through education by paying for their school fees, scholastic materials and meeting any other needs as they arise.

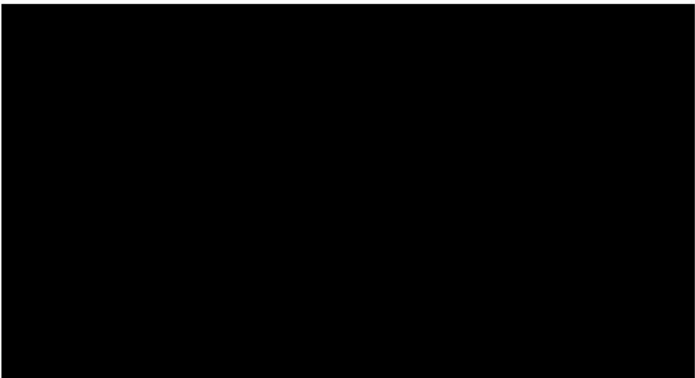
We are also excited to see how Butambala Nursey continues to grow – we have fundraising plans to help them develop a playground that can be used by the school children and the community.
