Structure, Governance and Management

Constitution

The Charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 6th January 2022. It was set up with a single-tier structure.

Appointment of Trustees

The above-mentioned trustees had their AGM on 18th June 2024 and meet three to four times a year. Meetings are carried out via zoom, due to the location of the members. There must be a minimum of three and a maximum of six trustees.

Objects

Charitable Purposes

The organisation is established for charitable purposes only, and in particular, the objects are:

- to advance animal welfare, in particular the welfare of stray cats and dogs in North Macedonia
- to advance and promote education concerning animal welfare

Achievements and Performance

During 2024, the charity supported the work of the Meow Paws Animal Shelter in North Macedonia who feed 200+ stray cats and dogs twice a day. They monitor their health, and take them for routine vaccinations, worming/flea/tick treatments and as funding allows, a neutering programme. They take in injured/harmed animals which are unfortunately very common. Vet fees are huge. We have focused in the first few months on fundraising and increasing our UK volunteer base.

We have also rehomed cats and dogs to homes in Scotland. Currently we only have rescue back up in Scotland and only two spaces for dogs, so we are limited in the number of dogs we can rehome as it is essential that animals do not enter the rescue system in the UK and always remain in the care of Meow Paws for life.

Financial Review

Income (£14602.12) & Expenditure (£14518.75)

The charity relied solely upon donations to provide their service throughout 2024.

Reserves Policy

It is the aim of the trustees to build a reserve account in time, in order to support foster care/vet's fees, etc, although funds have not allowed this yet.

Plans for the Future

The trustees discussed further development and growth of the charity in terms of developing the volunteer base, providing more foster homes and emergency rescue back up. We will continue to focus on our Go Fund Me campaign to develop the shelter in North Macedonia. We would like to put two more containers onto the land, sited on a concrete base, with comfortable enclosures inside allowing for cats and dogs to recover from neutering and surgery and to enable less sociable dogs and cats to be rescued. We have reached out to larger, longer established organisations in order to raise the profile of the charity. We have also begun to apply for grant funding from other rescue organisations to expand the shelter in North Macedonia.

Independent Examiner's Report on the Accounts

Report to the Trustees of Meow Paws North Macedonia SCIO, Registered Charity number SC051474 on the accounts of the charity for the period 01 February 2023 to 31 January 2025.

Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner
