Structure, Governance, and Management

Constitution

The Charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (a SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 26th May 2022. Prior to changing its legal form to a SCIO, the charity was an unincorporated association founded on 20th November 1968. The assets of the unincorporated association were transferred to the SCIO on the 1st July 2022. It has a single tier structure and as such the trustees are members of the charity.

Appointment of Trustees

The management committee, which normally meets on the last Friday of each month, are the charity's trustees. Membership of the management committee is open to all members of The Rotary Club of Clydebank, but it will always include those members currently holding the offices of President, President Elect (Vice President), Secretary, and Treasurer.

There must be a minimum of four and a maximum of eight trustees.

Objectives and Activities

Charitable purposes

The mission of Rotary is to provide service to others, promote integrity, and advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through our fellowship of business, professional, and community leaders. Rotary's seven areas of focus are as follows:

- Promoting peace. Rotary encourages conversations to foster understanding within and across cultures
- Fighting disease
- Providing clean water, sanitation, and hygiene
- Saving mothers and children
- Supporting education
- Growing local economies
- Protecting the environment

Activities

Members of The Rotary Club of Clydebank meet at 12:45 every Friday at Clydebank & District Golf Club. Recurring agenda items include:

- providing guest speakers an opportunity to bring to our attention causes that might be worthy of our support
- reviewing applications for support received from various local, national, and international causes
- planning fundraising events

Financial Review

During the course of the year ending 30th June 2025 a total of £7,855.00 was disbursed as charitable donations – see Note 11 on Page 5 for full details.

Our sources of funds are as follows:

- Annual Subscriptions of £120/member, comprising a Rotary Great Britain & Ireland (RGB&I) subscription of £78, a Rotary District 1320 subscription of £26, and £16 retained by the club to offset expenses.
- Ad-hoc donations from members attending the weekly club meeting.
- Fund raising events.
- Grants from Rotary Foundation, matching funds raised by the club for approved projects that meet the charitable objectives of one or more of Rotary's seven area of focus. In the year ending 30th June 2025 a District Grant of £695 was received, representing 35% of the donation of £2,000 made to the "Golden Friendships" project. The balance of the project was funded by The Rotary Club of Clydebank.
- Tax recoveries under the Gift Aid and Gift Aid Small Donations Schemes.

Reserves Policy

The trustees' policy is to retain 3 month's worth of normal running costs in order to meet commitments and cover any unexpected expenditure.

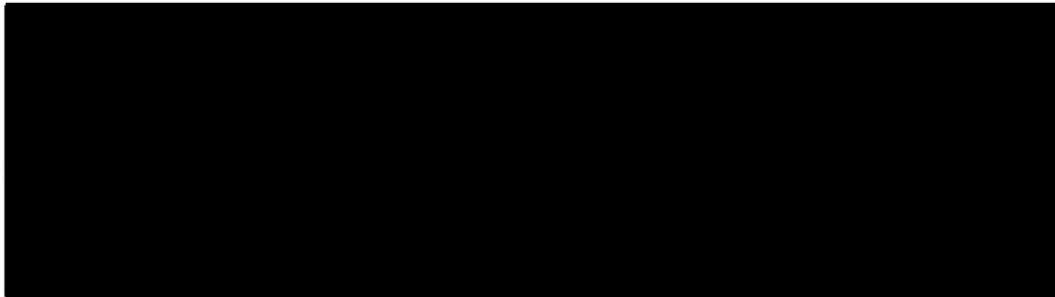

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT to the TRUSTEES of the ROTARY CLUB OF CLYDEBANK CHARITY SCIO

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 30th June 2024 which are set out on pages 3 to 5.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(d) of the 2006 Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under Section 44(1)(c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with these records.

It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
