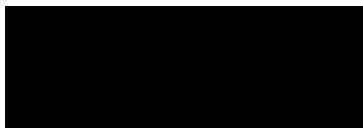

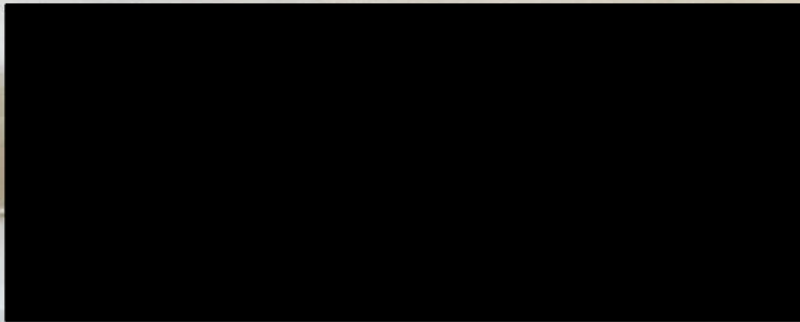

Independent Examiners Report to the Trustees of Knockando Community Multisport and Tennis Club

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31st August 2024 which are set out on the following pages.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of regulation 10(1) (d) of the 2006 Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with regulation 11 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

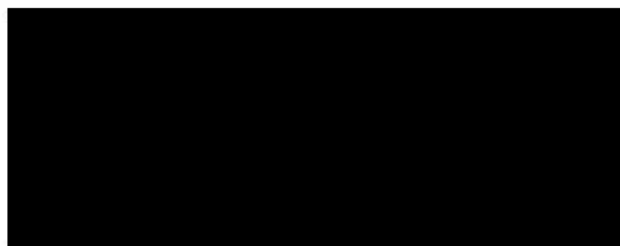

Structure, Governance and Management

Constitution

The Charity is a Scottish Charitable Unincorporated Organisation. It was registered in its current legal form on 5th August 2022.

Appointment of Trustees

Trustees are elected at the annual general meeting which is held in Spring. There must be a minimum of three and a maximum of five trustees. Trustees are elected from members of the local community who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills.

Objectives and Activities

Charitable Purposes

The advancement of public participation in sport and the provision of recreational facilities.

Activities

The charity organises an annual running event, the Speyside Windfarm Challenge every August/September.

Achievements and Performance

The 2024 Windfarm Challenge attracted 19 runners in the half marathon (a new event aimed to attract more runners, previously only a 12 mile race) , 5 for the 10k and 15 in the under 14 race.

Financial Review

The Windfarm Challenge raised £339. Edrington matched Windfarm Challenge funds raised contributing £966. A further £66 was raised through donations.

Reserves Policy

The trustees' policy is to retain £1,000 in order to cover any unexpected expenditure.

Plans for Future Period

The trustees intend to continue with the current fundraising activities and will seek to apply for funding from applicable charitable funds. Annual maintenance of the tennis courts will be carried out during the summer months.
