Activities: 'It carries out activities or services itself'

Purposes: 'the advancement of religion'

What the charity does: We hold worship services which everyone is welcome to attend. These are led by members of our own congregation whilst we have no full time pastor. Visiting speakers also come occasionally when available. There is a coffee morning every Wednesday and an annual event in the Haven Coffee Shop to support MacMillan Cancer Research. Alcoholics Anonymous are supported with a weekly meeting in one of our rooms and a group also meets to support bereaved people. Once a month a free breakfast is provided for the community and bags of groceries are given to those who need them. Special services are also celebrated at Easter, Christmas and on the occasion of baptisms when newly converted Christians profess their faith publicly. Various other Charities as are also supported financially with their ministry.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period	Weekly worship services for everyone have been maintained, using preachers from amongst our members with visiting preachers and missionary speakers. The church reaches out to the community through weekly Toddlers + Coffee mornings and Saturday Breakfast once a month. We also host Alcoholics Anonymous, Bereavement Group, Scottish Dancers and a Fostering Support Group. The coffee morning also led a successful McMillan's Coffee Morning in aid of the cancer charity. Regular Youth club has stopped this year, due to falling numbers, but the Young Adult group has grown. Alongside other churches, members became involved in a 'Try Praying' stall at the local Highland Games and a Christmas choir at the local Christmas fair. Financially, the church gives regularly to SOLAS (an outreach in UK to non-Christians) and an Indian relief mission, Mukti, to which some members travel to give practical support.

Holding weekly worship services; teaching of the Christian religion in home Bible studies; children's Sunday school and youth work; supporting overseas missionary work through prayer and giving.

Holding a Christian witness in our community has also involved serving the community through a Toddler group, Youth Café, Coffee morning and free Breakfast Club as well as community events to mark seasonal celebrations- Christmas, Easter, Harvest, etc.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Regular worship times and services for prayer, Bible study and children and youth were maintained and slightly expanded this session. The evening Young Adults group has expanded to include young adults from other churches. The Young Adults worship team now lead services once per month.

The 'Warm space' for teenagers weekly in the form of a drop-in café was originally supported by Fife Council. Funding has now ceased, but the provision has developed into a weekly youth club open to all of high-school age.

The part-time post for an Outreach worker was originally for 15 hours per week, but has now dropped to 10 hours per week.

4 trustees took part in a collaborative leadership course organised by the Baptist Union, held in our building. 'Lead Academy' worked with leaders from 2 other churches to enhance our leadership skills.

Our 2 Safeguarding Leads completed online courses and all those dealing with young or vulnerable people have PVG clearances.

Major roof repairs were required this session and new fascia and soffits were fitted around the building. Water ingress from the front roof was also fixed and the building is now water tight.

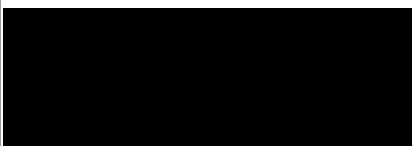
