The trustees have pleasure in presenting their report together with the financial statements and the independent examiner's report for the year ended 31st December 2023.

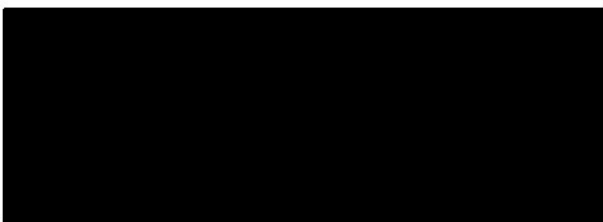

Structure, Governance and Management

Constitution

The charity is a Scottish charitable incorporated organization (a SCIO). It is governed by its constitution and the organisation was granted charitable status by OSCR on 27th September 2022.

Appointment of trustees

The management committee, which normally meets on monthly basis, as is also responsible for control and supervision of day-to-day operations of the organization.

The committee members are recruited from the membership and appointed at the AGM according to the constitution, in the event of mid-term resignation, people can be co-opted by the trustees and ratified at the next AGM. All committee meetings are quorate.

The main areas of fund raising were: faith events, money box collection via local retail businesses and social media campaign.

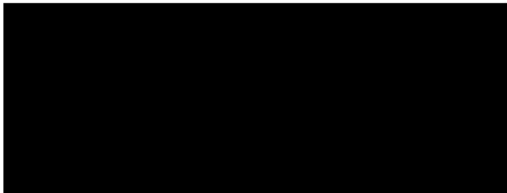
Plans for future periods

Basis of independent Examiner's statement

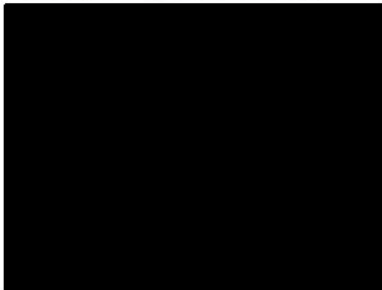

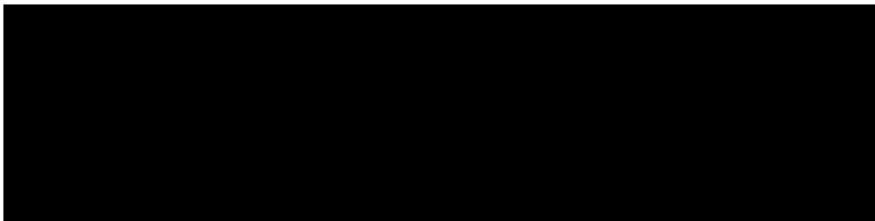
