Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

The financial year ending December 31st 2023, was our first year and very much a start up year putting in place core communication foundations. Such as website, social media, distribution list and newsletter. This work was all undertaken by volunteers.

The most significant and exciting achievement for the year, was the launch of the Wooden Spoon Frame Running Equipment Hub. The hub is the first of its kind. The purpose of the hub is to provide clubs access to running frames and accessories and in doing so help remove the equipment barrier to clubs providing opportunity. The hub loans equipment to new and existing clubs. It also coordinates equipment interchange "swap shop" between clubs. The hub was formed by Frame Running Scotland through the following partnerships: Wooden Spoon Rugby Charity, Neils Wheels Charity, Queen Margaret University, Victoria Park Athletics Club, Scottish Athletics, Scottish Disability Sport and ACE Race Running Charity.

We delivered an Introduction to Frame Running course.
