The trustees present their annual report together with the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2025.

Structure, Governance and Management

Constitution

Abiding Heart Education is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation. It is governed by its constitution and registered on 6th February 2023.

Trustees Recruitment & Appointment

The affairs of the charity are directed and managed by a Board of Charity Trustees. All members are trustees. New trustees are inducted by the more experienced trustees. At each AGM, one third the charity trustees elected/appointed shall retire from office – but shall then be eligible for re-election. A charity trustee retiring at an AGM will be deemed to have been re-elected unless:

- (a) they advise the board prior to the conclusion of the AGM that they do not wish to be re-appointed as a charity trustee; or
- (b) an election process was held at the AGM and they were not among those elected/re-elected through that process.

Objectives and Activities

- Strengthen organisational foundations. Update course policies, health and safety procedures, and other key governance documents.
- Add a new gallery exhibition, improve the reception area, complete the contemplative room, and begin setting up the experiential learning room and library.
- Strengthen organisational foundations. Update course policies, health and safety procedures, and other key governance documents.
- Increase community engagement. Conduct open days and build interest within the local community.
- Integrate local heritage into curriculum development
- Study the area's history and sense of place and begin designing curriculum content reflecting these elements
- Fundraise for sustainability and development of our education activities
- Secure funding to support being able to subsidise our education activities
- Secure funding to support being able to subsidise our education activities and continue improving the physical facility.

Public benefit

In 2025, we delivered a range of educational and contemplative programmes:

- In-person retreats held at the centre
- Himalayan Heritage Art online courses (ongoing, long-term)
- Education Renewal Course (online long-term)

Both the Himalayan Heritage Art course and the Education Renewal course are continuing programmes designed to develop over several years

We also offered

- Short workshops for parents
- Short contemplative retreats
- A series of lectures exploring contemplative education and cultural heritage

Centre Development and Facilities

In 2025, we made important improvements to our premises in Castle Douglas:

- Added a new exhibition to the centre's gallery
- Improved and updated the reception room
- Updated public information about the charity and its activities (posters, leaflets, website and social media)
- Continued improving Abiding Heart's centre in Castle Douglas including physical facility and policies and procedures

- Continued decorating and improving areas of the premises
- Completed the Contemplative Room
- Partially set up the Experiential Learning Room and Library

Progress on some facility improvements was slowed due to limited funding. We were able to further complete part of the required upgrades and will continue fundraising efforts to support further development.

Community Engagement

- Conducted open days to welcome the local community
- Generated initial interest and engagement locally
- Recognised that building sustained community participation will be a gradual. Long-term process

Course Design, Curriculum and Research Development

In 2025, we:

- Studied the area, understanding the sense of place, heritage, and the demographic of the local community.
- Began designing curriculum content integrating local history and cultural identity into out educational activities
- Designed new short contemplative courses to be a combination of e-course, and in-person courses.

The curriculum development work will continue over the coming years as part of our long-term vision.

Marketing and Fundraising

Updated marketing and information posters, leaflets and the charity shop's front window.

Fundraising: searched for new possible funders, write proposals and letters to potential donors.

Financial Review

During the year the charity made a surplus of £3,810 (2024: £6,206).

Reserves Policy

The charity has a policy to have unrestricted reserves cover a minimum of three months unrestricted expenses (estimated at £4,000).

At the year end unrestricted cash reserves of £10,016 exceed the policy and therefore the trustees consider the charity a Going Concern.

Future Plans

In 2026 we will:

- Continue monthly talks
- Continue weekly mediation sessions
- Continue running personal development courses and retreats
- Continue offering:
 - The 3-year education courses
 - Short personal development courses
 - Heritage online courses
- Continue developing the Education Renewal course and its resources
- Launch the Abide: Supporting Home Educating families

The online Education Renewal project is planned as a 3-5 year development initiative, including expansion of the e-classroom and resource database.

Programme Development Goals

In 2026 we aim to:

- Our main priority is to continue to develop the Education Renewal e-classroom and resource database – as this is the heart of the work we do
- Offer learning support to home-educating families
- Reformat and strengthen existing courses
- Continue developing the puppet plays programme (grant dependant)
- Launch the Thomas McGill Duncan programme and art exhibition (grant dependant)

- Developing new income-generating initiatives

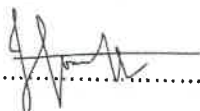

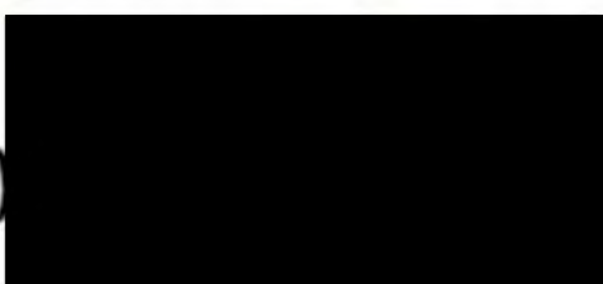
